CB'ers BEWARE! The Feieral Communications Commission (FCC) has warned citizen's band (CB)
radio operators that improper placement of transradio operators that improper placement of trans-
mitters in cars may cause gasoline explosions. Especially hazardous are transmitters installed in the trunk or with bumper mounted whip antennas (because of their proximity to the vehicle's gas tank and filler pipe). The FCC says CB'ers should never transmit while their cars are being filled
with gas because sparks from the radio equinment with gas because sparks from the radio equipment
could ignite gasoline fumes. Explosions and flash fires are rare, the agency says, but definitely possible when loose
tions create sparks.
