Lynx Choir To Present 'Show Time'

The 95-voice Spearman High School choir and special groups will present "Show Time" at 7:30 p. m. Thursday in the High School auditorium.

Choir Director Lewis Tilford said the program gets its name from the program of music from Broadway musicals including "Westside Story", "Sound of Music", "South Pacific" and others.

Featured on the program besides the choir will be the Boys Glee Club, Girls Glee Club, Lynx Minstrels and Missing Lynx Girls' Sextette.

Tilford said the program will consist mostly of light, entertaining music.

The choir will close the program with two Christmas songs, "He Came Here for Me" by Ron Nelson and "Hallelujah Chorus" by Handel.

Admission is \$1 for adults and 50 cents for students.

'Messiah' Set Sunday

The annual program of Christmas selections from the "Messiah" will be presented at 3 p. m. Sunday, Dec. 19, in the High School auditorium by the Community Choir.

This 40-voice choir, directed by Lewis Tilford, is composed of members of many of the church choirs of Spearman. The choir and soloists will be accompanied by Verna Lee Schnell and Mrs. Max Baggerly.

Besides the Christmas selections from the "Messiah" the choir will sing the "Hallelujah Chorus".

Soloists for the program will be Mary Brock, Karen Countiss, Jenny Lynn Massad, Charlene Tilford, Jim Cherry and Lewis Tilford.

There is no admission charge and everyone is invited to come and hear this presentation of many of the traditional songs of Christmas.

Spearman Teams Get To Division Finals

Spearman's basketball teams were in the finals and consolation finals of the Gruver tournament Saturday afternoon.

The powerful Lynxettes were to meet the Gruver girls in the finals Saturday night. The Lynx played Stratford Saturday afternoon.

The Lynx went into the consolation bracket of the tournament Thursday evening when they ran into the scoring machine from Adrian and fell 92-69.

Lynx Win

Larry Butts, Carl Close and Dave Clement sparked the Spearman Lynx to the Consolation title of the Gruver Invitational Tournament.

Spearman beat Stratford 59-52 in the consolation finals Saturday afternoon.

Butts scored 21, Close 17 and Clement 11 in the come-from-behind victory.

Spearman ran up its highest score of the season in the game but they were no match for the running, shooting Adrian crew. Adrian was leading 24-7, 49-20 and 77-38 at the end of the quarters.

Carl Close led the Lynx in scoring 10 field goals and one free shot for 21 points. Mike Hendricks had 13.

The Lynxettes were powerful in their first two games. They ripped Adrian 72-31 and Booker 57-16.

Everyone saw plenty of action in the games. In the first game Barbara Wilde led the scoring with 22 points. Freshman Marcia Shieldknight ripped in 20 points. Karen Gibson had 16 and Susan Hutchison 10 as four Lynxettes were in the double figures.

Booker could do nothing

against the Lynxettes as they fell 57-16. Barbara Wilde scored 34 of the Lynxette points.

In the second game for the Lynx, they were slow getting started and led only 17-13 at the half. They were trailing 22-24 at the end of the third period but came alive in the fourth for 21 points to win 43-34. Larry Butts led the scoring with 17 points.

The Spearman teams will be at home Tuesday night when they play Stratford. Thursday they open the district race with games at Fritch.

Spearman Volunteer Firemen answered fire alarms Friday and Saturday afternoons.

Saturday afternoon a '51 truck owned by C. W. Wagner of Spearman was destroyed in a fire eight miles south and two miles east of Spearman on the Allen Pierce farm.

Firemen said the truck was a total loss except for the tires. Friday afternoon firemen went to a small grass fire at 317 S. Archer. No damage was done by the blaze.

HOME DEMOLISHED

Only Minor Injuries For Explosion Victim

A Spearman woman received only minor injuries Thursday afternoon when her home exploded around her.

Mrs. Inez Kirk, 56, is in good condition in Hansford Hospital with a fractured right arm and abrasions received in the explosion.

The widow told her neighbor, Mrs. Arthur Adkison, she was sitting at her kitchen table reading when her home was almost demolished around her.

Investigators said an accumulation of gas caused the blast. Mrs. Adkison was driving in the drive-way of her home when the Kirk home at 213 S. Hazelwood exploded.

"There were two explosions," Mrs. Adkison said. "The first was the largest and sent the front porch roof flying into the yard and blew the windows out. The smaller blast sounded and I could hear things falling in the house."

Mrs. Adkison and her daughter jumped out of their car and ran to the Kirk house.

"I was screaming for help and for someone to help," Mrs. Adkison said.

Mrs. Bill Boatwright who lives four blocks away on the corner of Seventh and Lee said she heard the explosion and could hear someone screaming.

Howard Thomas who lives next door, south of Mrs. Kirk's home rushed to the Kirk home and went in the house to get the woman.

He went in the front door and had to climb over and through the wreckage hunting the woman, Mrs. Kirk is deaf and has a speech handicap. She could not call for help.

Thomas said he found Mrs. Kirk standing in the door of her back bedroom. A small hall

separates the kitchen where she had been reading and the bedroom.

From her hospital bed Mrs. Kirk said Friday that she did not know what happened. She told Mrs. Adkison that when the house exploded, she could not see anything and did not remember being helped from the house.

Mrs. Adkison said the explosion happened about 5:20 p. m.

There was no fire. The fire department kept a watch of the house for several hours. Firemen theorized that the force of the explosion combined with the falling insulation prevented any fire.

The explosion ripped the front porch roof from the house, blew all four walls out from the foundation, shattered all the windows and left the roof on the south side sagging and all the ceilings inside destroyed.

The furniture in the rooms was turned over and some of it smashed. Everything in the house was covered in several inches of insulation and dirt from the ceiling.

The house is of frame and stucco construction. Some firemen said that the sturdy construction was all that kept it from collapsing.

Mrs. A. L. Jackson said this week her parents owned the house for many years. Her father bought it because it was well built. Mrs. Jackson sold the house to the Kirks several years ago.

Mrs. Kirk is the widow of Joe Kirk, a printer who worked for the Spearman Reporter for a number of years before his death about five years ago.

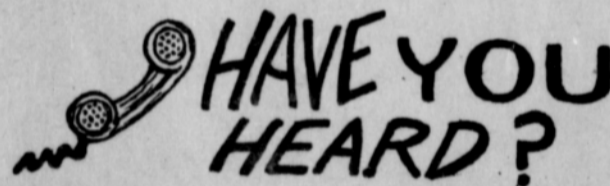

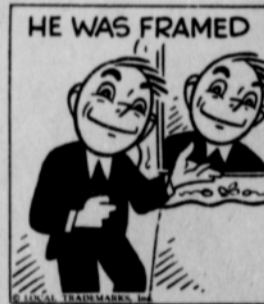

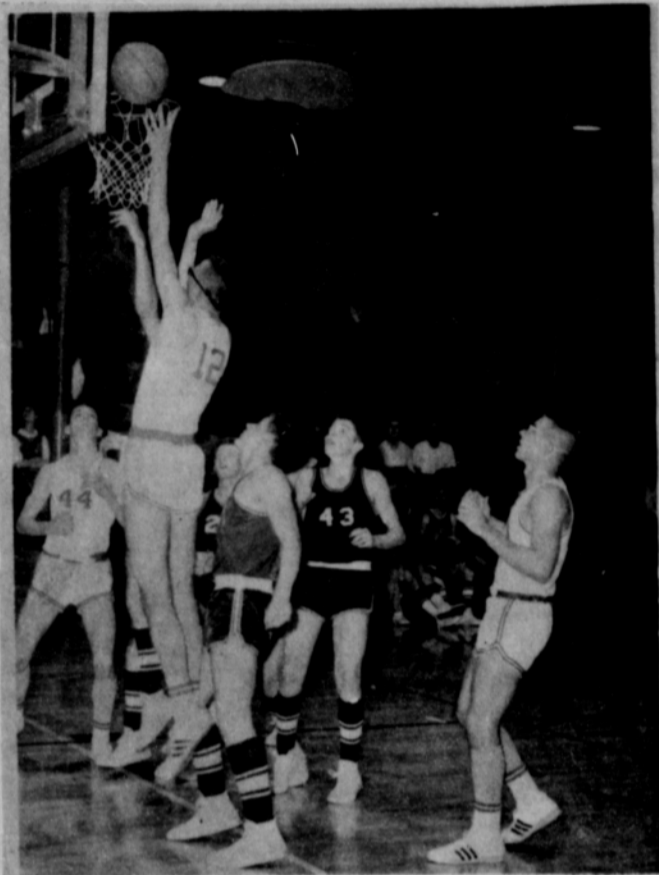
