challenging, and a person really knows if he is doing some good or not.

even more negative. I have always tried to em even more negauve. have always nied to em
phasize the positive side of life instead of the
negative." negative".
During During presentence investigations, Larson
would interview a defendant and recommend would interview a defe
punishment to the judge.
I can truthrully say that out of all of those
recommendations I made, my conscience is recommendations I made, my conscience
