Proposed Amendment to the State Constitution Authorizing the Levy of a Tax to Pay Jurors.

TOENT RESOLUTION amending Section of of Article S. of the Constitution of the State of Texas, providing for the levying of a tax of not exceeding officen cents on the one hundred dollars valuation to pay jurers.
