A Letter.

Tahoka Texas. March 7th. 1907

To the Lynn County News,

Dear Sir:-

On Tuesday the 5th inst. I left this town on a business visit to the little town of Gail in Borden County.


The ground is getting too dry to plow, so the farmers will get to rest a few days.
