ELECTION OF TRUSTEES-AT-LARGE

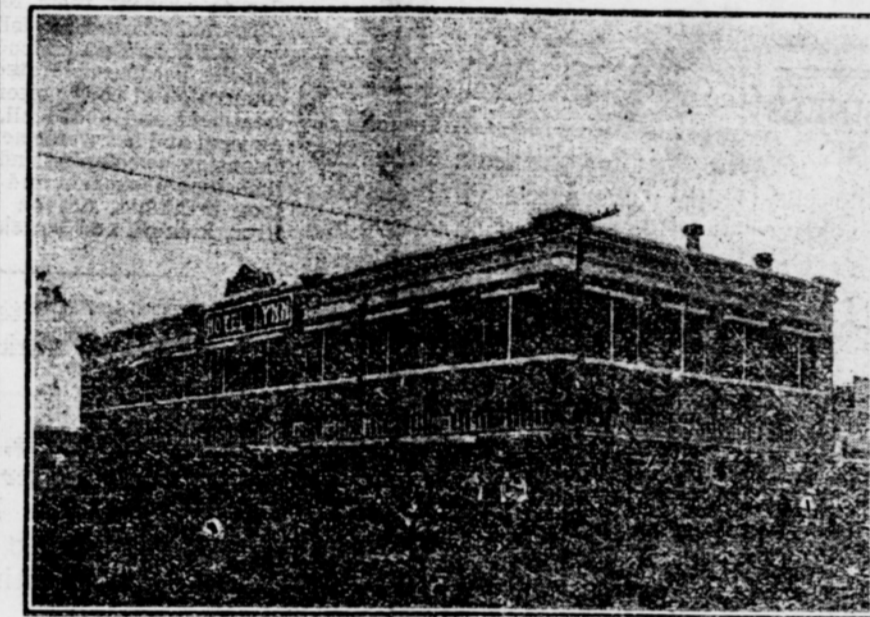

The Hotel Lynn, pictured above, which was destroyed by fire on December 29, 1915 was 55x125 feet two stories. This new, modern hotel will be one story higher and a basement beneath.

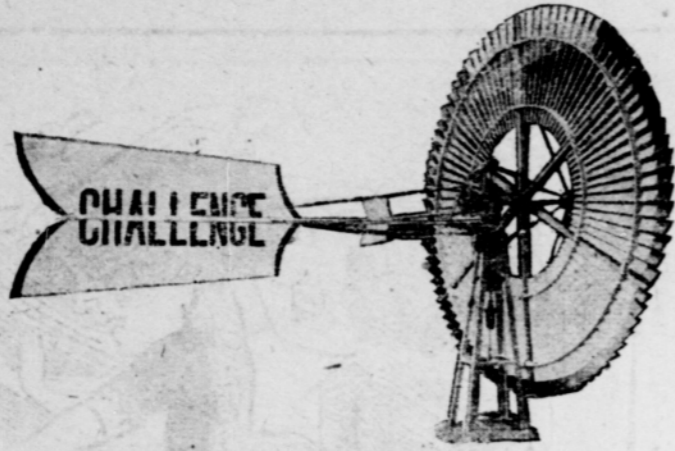

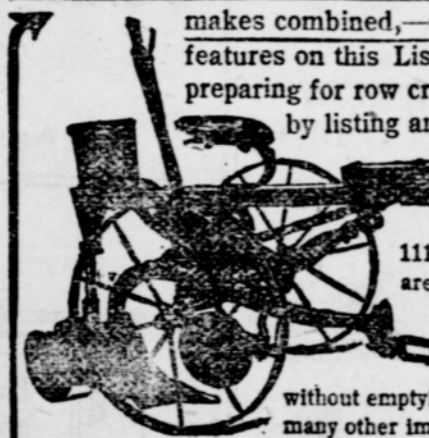

Produce More Foodstuff

From the Government crop report issued March 8th, it appears that there is only one-third as much wheat in the hands of the farmers at this report as at the same time last year, while pries are fully a third higher. The per cent of corn is about 20 per cent less and oats nearly 50 per cent less. Prices on both the last named grains are much higher.

Before the end of the year the United States is apt to be at war with one or more of the major nations of the world, and in modern warfare the food supply is one of the chief weapons. The above noted shortage leaves this nation with too small a margin, and added to this, millions of pounds of cereal grains being sent to the bottom of the ocean every week.

This planting season offers a great opportunity to the farmer to show his patriotism. The lack of food will force a nation to surrender almost as soon as a shortage of ammunition. We believe one could say that food stuff is more important than ammunition at the outbreak of hostilities, for the first article can only be increased after a growing season while the latter can be increased in a few weeks.

Every available acre of tillable land should be devoted to the culture of food this season, for at war or in peace it will be the task of America to feed a great portion of the world this coming year.
