More Water, And Not So Much Danger From Fire.

A two horse-power gasoline engine arrived Monday and has been put in place at the north well for the purpose of supplying the town with water when the wind fails to blow. This engine is a move in the right direction made by the county for the comfort of the citizens and should be appreciated accordingly. We see in our exchanges where lots of our sister towns are perfecting a fire protection. Now all Tahoka needs is a larger storage tank placed high enough to provide the proper amount of pressure and more hose and our business men could feel safe from fire. We might never need it, but if we did what then?

Another Connection.

Tahoka is now in direct connection with Seminole and all points west to Carlsbad N. M. on the Peco-Valley.

Mr. Arthur Holloway of Lamesa has started a hack line from that enterprising little city which will leave daily for the New Mexico railroad town and make the round trip in a week—three days each way. It will now be possible to leave Tahoka at dinner time Monday and get to Carlsbad Thursday night at a cost of \$14—much cheaper than the rail and hack fare route via Big Springs.

Mr. Holloway has been in the land business at Lamesa for some time but is now located at the new town of Knowles N. M. a growing little city with splendid prospects.

Mr. Holloway and his fellow citizens at Lamesa deserve great credit for this and other enterprises. They certainly know how to push their town and county to the front.

A great many new residences are now nearing completion and several more will be built just as soon as the lumber arrives.

The new Baptist and Methodist church buildings will be started some time in the next month or two and pushed to completion as rapidly as men and materials can be obtained.

HIDES BOUNTY
