## News Would Disarm Officers.

Small acorns sometimes grow on large trees, and some editors of big papers occasionally make editorial utterances, the absurdity of which, would make a laughing-stock of even a paper like ours, to say nothing of a metropolitan daily.

One, Bill Stortz, who, through a department in the Dallas News entitled "State Press," seeks to influence the country press of Texas, perpetrates this bright idea on a long-suffering public:

"The law ought to prevent peace officers from carrying deadly weapons unless they are engaged in the pursuit of criminals."

We believe that an officer, like a doctor, should at all times be prepared for any emergency, and if an officer is to be allowed to carry a pistol any of the time, he should be allowed to carry one all the time if he thinks it necessary. The law directs that officers be on the look-out for lawbreakers all the time. An officer never knows when he will meet some dangerous criminal who would certainly not wait for the officer to get his gun. The very fact that peace officers are always armed serves the double purpose of curbing the criminal class and inspiring honest people with such a feeling of security as to minimize any tendency on their part to carry pistol for their own protection.

We endorse State Press on their diversion and factory building platform, question they thoroughly understand, but when they branch out into moral issues, they may expect to get into some awkward positions. Every chief and member in the land will heartily endorse State Press in their effort to limit peace officers in carrying arms.

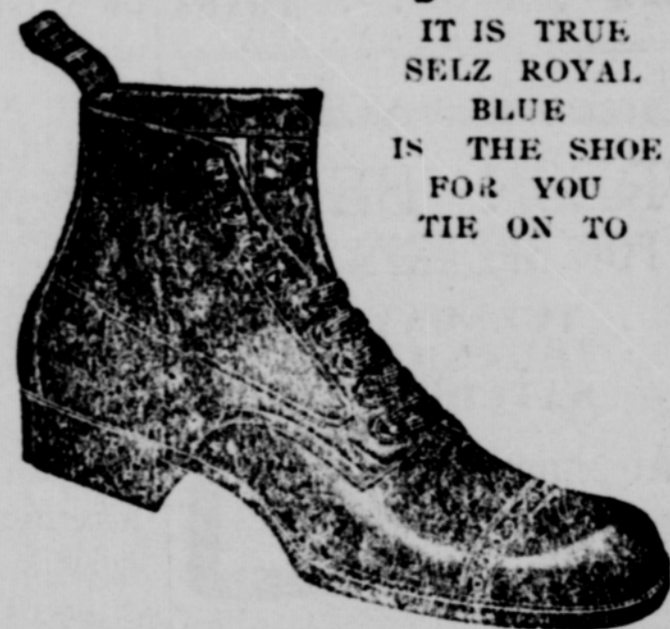
