Railroad Charter Filed.

Roscoe, Snyder and Pacific Has \$200,000 Capital.

Austin, Tex., Oct., 1.—The Attorney General approved and the Secretary of State filed the charter of the Roscoe, Snyder & Pacific Railway Company, with principal office at Roscoe, Nolan County, Capital Stock \$200,000. Purpose construction of a line of railroad from Roscoe, on the Texas and Pacific, northwest through the counties of Nolan, Fisher, Scurry, Borden, Lynn, Lubbock, Hockley, Cochran and Bailey on the New Mexico line, a distance of 200 miles. Incorporators: E. W. James, J. E. Wills, Eugene Wood, W. G. Swenson, Ed Hughes, Henry James and J. M. Wagstaff, all of Abilene, Tex., and N. T. Reed and A. A. Reed, both of Hutchinson, Kansas.—Dallas News.

STEEL SECURED.

Mr. S. W. Grimes returned from Abilene last Saturday, and he states that while gone he had an interview with Gen. James, the promoter of Snyder's new railroad, who stated that he had secured the steel and would probably complete the road in nine months. Surveyors are now running the line from Roscoe and will be in Snyder in few days. The contract for grading has been let, and dirt on the grade will be broken as soon as the survey is completed. Gen. James is quoted as saying that the road will be pushed to completion as soon as possible. The road in all probability will be in operation in time to handle next year's crop.—Snyder Western Light.
