The Governor of this Stat, is hereby directed to issue the necessary proclamation submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of Texas at the next general election held in this State, or in case aty previous election shall be had in the State for other purposes. then this proposed amendment thall pe submitted to the qualified taz pasing voters. And the sum of $\$ 2000$. or so much thereof as shall be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the treasury of the State of Texas for the purpose of submittin; this propesition to a vote of the people of the State of Texis.  Constitution Creating the Office of Commissioner of Agriculture.Jaint Resoluthen proposing an amendraent to Arricle fout (4) of the Constitution of the State of Texas. by addinz theretoa section to be knowifas SecSion 27, providag for a Depatment of Agriculture, with a burean of habor.
B. it Reseived by the L-gislature of the State of Texas.
Saction 1. That Article four (4) of tio Constitution of the State of rexas, in amended by adding thereto Sevtion 27, when a majority of the qualibied elecwirs of the Legislature of Texas at an e.e.tion for that purpose shall vote in favor of the amendment, shall read as follows:
Section 27. The Legislature shall pro vide for the office of Commissionier of Ag ilculture, who shall be either elected by the qualified voters of the State, or appointed by the Governor - ith the divice and cotsent of two-thirdsof che Sienate as the Legislature may provide; whose term of office, duties and salary shall be prescribed by law; in which department there shall be eatablished by the Legislature a bureau of labor, when required by the publie interest.
Sec. 2. The Governor of this State is hereby directed to issue and have pubHshed the necessary proclamation for the sumission of tnis resointion to the qualified voters for members of the Legislature of the State of Texas. as an amendment to the Censtitution of Texas. tobe voted upon on the first Tuesday in Aligust, 1907. All porsons favoring said amendment shall have written or printed on their bellots, as follows: "For the amendment to the Constitution, providing for a Department of Agriculture and a Bureau of Labor" And those opposed to said amendment shall have written or printed on their ballots, as follows: "Against the amendment to the Censtitation, providing for a Department of Agriculture and a Bureau of Labor." And the sum of ( $\$ \mathbf{8} 000$ ) two thousand dellars or so much thereof as many be any funds in of Texas, not otherwise appropriated, to pay the expenses of such publications, proclamation and election.
