### Correspondence-Philippine

BY S. E. DERACKEN. THE ONLY HOPE OF SUCCESS.

Zamboanga, Moro Province, P. I. July 1, 1907.

-If the American Government should pull out of the Philippine Islands, even after having started the natives on the highroad to selfgovernment, as they did the Cubans, leaving no greater obstacles to nation building than the inexperience, ignorance and sloth of the people them-elves, it is the honest conviction of 99 Americans out of every 100 who are here today that the experiment would be a failure in much less time than it proved to be in Cuba.

The danger can be mitigated, but not cured, by the retention of the Moro country, both as regards the danger to the Fil pinos which arises from their proximity to the Moros, and as a point of ob-ervaion and quick action in case of necessity. With American government transfered to Zamboanga, and the conviction forced upon the Filipinos that armed revolution vould speedily result in American intervention here as in Cuba. rould exercise a wholesome resraint, and check a natural tendeny the leaders to commit overt acts.

### OBSERVE SANITARY REGU-LATIONS.

The State Health Officer will appoint inspectors in every city and town in the state to enforce 20th., day of August, A. D. 1907. the rigid sanitary laws which go into effect Sept. 1st. A fine of from \$50 to \$200 is the penalty for violating any provisions and the following metes and bounds, to-wit: law will be enforced to the letter. Churches, schools, railway coaches. depots, hotels, restaurants, meat markets, opera houses and many other buildings must be kept in accordance with these saitary regulations.

### A GLIMPSE AT THE HOME LIFE OF THE DOUKHOBORS

"One of the most interesting bodies of people on this continent are the Doukhobors." says a writ er in the October issue of the New Idea Woman's Magazine. She continues thus: "Interesting not alone because of their peculiar religious beliefs, but because they are a people who bave succeeded for six years in conducting a large social community with comparatively little friction, and with material gain to themselves. They came to Canada from Russia penniless, but today own land, stock, and the latest and most approved agricultural impliments, while all business is conducted on a community basis." The many photographs which accompany the article attest to the primitive simplicity of the Donkhobor life. Their success is based on their mastery of many practical trades as well as their ability to withstand the greatest hardships. The intense religious ardor of these pgople has affected their made of life in many curious ways, which will be of great interest to all readers.


