Youth at Silverton Found Dead and Supposedly took Life With Target Rifle

Information reached Amarillo from Silverton today to the effect that Roy Ragland, a youth of seventeen years of age, was found dead Monday night in his room at the home of his brother, W. F. Ragland, following the report of a gun shot. A target rifle was found in the room, and a charge presumably from that weapon had crashed through the brain of the unfortunate boy, producing instant death.

The boy had been in indifferent health for a number of months, a fact that caused fits of despondency. He arrived in Silverton only last week from Roby and was visiting with his brother. He was intellectual and studious and had made much progress in an educational way. No one was present at the time of the infliction of the fatal wound, and details of the tragedy will never be known. Funeral services were held for the young man yesterday afternoon at Silverton.
