Proposed Amendment to the State Constitation Providing for the Creation of Improvement Districts in Certain Cities. Jonrt Rasotoriow amending Section 9 , of Article 8 , of the Constitution of the State of Texas, providing for the erees tion of improvement districta in cities of more than five thoussand inhabitants and charging the cost of certain improvements made therein against the abutting property.
Saction i. Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas: That Section 9 of Article 8 of the Constitution of the State of Texas, be so amended *p to hereafter read as follows:
Sxc. 9. The State tax on property, exclusive of the tax necessary to pay the public debt, and of the taxes provided for the benefit of public free schools, shall aever exceed ti irty-five cents on the one hundred dollars valuation; and no county, city or town shall levy more than twenty ive cents for city or county purposes, and not exceeding fifteen cents for roads and bridges, and not exceeding fifteen sents to pay jurors, on the hundred dollars valuation, except for payment of debts incured prior to the adoption of the amendment September 25. A D, 1887, and for the erection of public buildings, streets, sewers, water works and other permanent improvements, not to exceed twenty-five cents on the one humdred dolars valuation, in any one year, and except as is in this Constitution otherwise provided; and the Legis'ature may also uthorize an additional annual ad valorem tax to be levied and collected for the further maintenance of the public roads: provided, that a majority of the qualified property taxpaying voters of the county roting at an election to be held for that purpose shall vote such tax, not to exceed fifteen cents on the one hundred doars valuation, of the property subject to taxation in such county. And the Legislature may pass local laws for the maincenance of the public roads and highways, without the local notice required for apecial or local haws.
In addition to the foregoing, cities of more than five thousand inhabitants may tay out within their corporate limits, improvement districts in which they, by and with the consent of a majority of the taxpayers owning real estate therein, may build sidewalks and charge the cost thereof against the abutting property, and may build sewers and pave streets and charge one-third of the cost thereof against the abutting peoperty on either side of the streets upon which such improvements are made in such district, and the amount charged against all such abutting property shall be deemed and held to be a tax against and a lien upon such sbatting property, and the Legislature is required to enact laws prescribing the means for ascertaining the amount properly chargeable against each parcel of abutting property, and providing for the enforcenent of its collection.
Ske. 2. The Governor is hereby directed to issue the necessary proclamation for submitting this amendment to the Constitution to the qualified voters of the State of Texas on the first Tuesday in August, A. D. 1907 , at which election all voters favoring this amendment shall have written or printed ou their ballots: "For the amendment to Section 9 of Ar tiele 8 of the Constitution, permitting property owners in cities of more than five thousend inhabitants to create improvement distriets, one-third the cost of which to be charged against abutting property on either side of the street."

And the voters opposed to said amendment shall have written or printed on their ballots the following: "Against the amendment to Section 9 of Article 8 of the Constitution, permiting property owners in cities of more than five thousand inhabitants to create improvement districts, one-third the cost of which to be charged against abutting property or either side of the street.
Sre. 3 The lateness in the session, the crowded condition of the calendars of both houses, and the importance of this proposed amendment, create an emergency and an imperative public recessity demanding that the constitutional rule, and Senate Rule No. 37, requiring bills to be read on three several days be suspended, and the same are hereby suspended. Proposed Amendment to the State Constitntion Providing for the Establishment of a Home for Confederate Widows.
Jonrt Resolutiox to amend Section 5 , of Article 3 of the Constitution of the State of Texas, as amended in 1903, so as to authorize the grant of aid in the establishment and maintenance of home for the disabled and dependent wives and widows of Coniederate soldiers and sailors and such women as aided the Confederacy, and making an appropriation.
sizction r. Be it Resolved by the Leg. islature of the State of Texas: That Seetion 51 of Article 3 of the Constitution of the State of Texas, as amended in 1903, be so amended as to hereafter read as follows: Article 3. Section 51. The Legislature dhall have no power to make any grant or authorize the making any grant of public mowey to any individual, associations or individuals, municipal or other corporationa whatsoever; provided, however, the Legislature may grant aid to indigent and disabled Confederate soldiers and sailor who came to Texas prior to January 1,1880 , and who are either over sixty years of age or whose disability is? ${ }^{\text {th }}$ the proximate result of actual service in the Cosfederate army for a period of at least three months, their widows in indigent arcumstances who have never remarried and who have been bona fide residents of the State of Texas since March $\mathbf{1}, 1880$, and who were married to such soldiers anterior to March 1, 1880; provided said aid shall not exceed eight dollars per month, and provided further, that no appropriations shall ever be made for the purpose hereinbefore specified in excess of five hundred thousand dollars for any one year. And also grant aid to the establishment and maintenance of a home for said soldiers and sailors, their wives and widows and women who alded in she Confederacy, under such regutaitong and Ituitations as may be provided by law; provided the grant to ald sald home shall not exceed one hondred and afty thousand dollars for any one year, and no inmate of said howes shall be entitied to any other aid from the state; the Legiolature may provide for husband and wife to remain together in this home; and provided further, that the provisfons of this section shall not be construed to prevent the grant of ald in case of pobtiecalanity.
Swi. 2. The Governor of the Siate is ereay directed to issoe the vecestary proclamation for the subenission of this amendment to the qua!ified voters of the Stite of Texas on the first Tuesday in Augast, 1807.

The sum of $\$ 5000$, or so much thereo as may be necessary, is hareby appropriated to pay the expenses of carcying out the provisions of this resolution.

Proposed Amendment to the State Constitution Fixing the Salary of Members of the Legislature.
Ax Acr to amend Section 24 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Teras, relating to the compsnsation of members of the Legiflature.
Be it enacted by the Legisiature of the State of Texas:
Sxcrios 1. That Section 24 of Article III of the Constitition of the State of Texas be amended no as to hereafter read as follows:
section 24. The mumbers of the Leg. islature shall receive from the Public Treasury such compensation for their services as may from time to time be prcvided by law, not to exceed one thousand dollars for each year in whtch a bennial ression of the Legislature is held ander the provissonv of this Gonstitution and five dollars for each day of any Special Session held during the snbsequent year, and in addition thereto, they shall receive milteage in going to and returning froun the state Capital, not to exceed three cents a mfle; distance to be computed by nearest rallroad route, and the comptroller shall prepare and preserve a table of distances for each county seat now or hereafter to bé established, and by such table the mileage of each member shall be pald; no member shall be entitled to mileage for any extra session that mav be calles within one day after the adjournment of a Regular or Called Session.
Ezc. 2. The foregolng Constitutiond! Amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the quallfied electors of the State at an election to be held throughout the State on the first Tupaday in Augusi, 1907, at which election all voters favoring said proposed amendment, shall have written or printed on their ballots, the words: "For the amendment to Section 24 of Article III of the Constitation, relating to the salary of the members of the Legislature," and all those opposed shall have written or printed on their ballots, the words, "Againet the amendment to Section 24 of Article III of the Constitation, relating to the salary of the members of the Lestelature."
skc. 3. The Governor of the State is hereby directed to issue the necessary proclamation for sald election and to have the same published as required by the Constitution and laws of the state, and the sum of $\mathbf{8 1 0 0 0}$ or so mnch thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated ont of the general revenue of the State not otherwise approprlated to pay the expenses of such publication and rlection.

Proposed Amendment to the State Constitution Autorizing the Fistablishment of a State Printing Plant.
Soint kreot,ution authorizing the mubmission to a vote of the people of the state of Texas of a proposed amendment of Section 21. Article XVI, of the Constitution of the state of Texas, relating to printing, pubilshing, stationery, paper and fuel, and makking an appropriation therefor. Be is Resolved by the Leglastature of the

State of Texas:
Szcrion 1. That Section 21 of Article XVI of the Constitution of the State of Texas be so amended as to hereafter read as follows:
Section 21. All printing and publish ing, and all atationery, paper and fuel for various departmeats, and for all ofices, whether created by this Constitution or by law, shall be done and supplied as may be provided by law, and for the accomplishment of these objects and purposes the Legislature may provide and estathsh all requisite means and agencles, finvested with such powers as may be deemed adequate and sdvisable swc. 2. The foregning constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of the State as an election to be held throughout the State on the firs Tues Jay fin Angast A. D. 1967, at which election ath voters favoring said proposed amendment shall write or have printed on their ballots. the words "Kor the amendment to Section 21 of Articie XVI of the Constitution, relating to staitionery, prihting. paper and fuel" said all those opposed shall write or have prinied on their ballits the words "A Asainst the dimendment to Section 27 of Article XVI of the Constitution, relatinz to rtationery, printing. paper and fuel.

Src. 3. The Governur of the State is hereby directed to isxne the necessary proclamation for ald election and to have the same published as required by the Constitution and existing laws of the State.

SEc. 4. That the snm of two thousand ( $\$ 2000$ ) dollars. or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby approprication and election

Proposed Amendment to the State Constitution Amthorizing the Levy of a Road Tax,
Jonst Resol.urioy airending Nection 9, Article 8, of the Constitution of the State of Texas, by adding thereto a sectlon to be known as seetifon 9a, increasing the amount of tax that may be voted for the purpose of improving public roads, and to ullow rounties or political subdivisions of conmeies br a majority vote of the quallficd property tax paying voters of the county, or subdivision thereof, vethg at all electlons, to be held for that purpoce, to adopt same.
Be it Resolved by the Leglslature of the State of Texas:
Sketron 1. That Section 9 of Articla 8 of the Consti-ution of the State of Texis be amended by addinz thereto Section 9s, which shall read as follows:
Section 9a. A majority of the property tax paing voters in aly county or one or more political subdivisious thereof, in this'state, voting at as election held for that purpose zay vote a tax for road and bridge phrposegs not to excege 30 centa on the 8100 valuation of property subject to texation in such county or political subdivision of sueb couuty, or may issue bonds not to exceed 20 por cent of the assessed value of the real cent of the assessed value of the real
property in such district, for such road and bridge purposes, provided that such tax, or proceeds of such bonds, shall be expended in the territory in which it is voted, and no other, and this provision of the Constitution shall be self-enacting without the necessity of further legislaated, out of any funds in the Treasuary of the State of Texas uot otherwise app.o. priated, to pay the expenses of suct pubiltions.

Saction 1. That Article four (1) of the Constitution of the State of Texas. he amended by adding thereto foce thn 97, when a majority of the qualitied electors of the Legislature of Texas at an election for that purpmes shall vote in favor of the amendment, shall read as follows:
Section 27. The Iegislasure shall proride tor the office of Commissioner of Agriculture, who shait be either ele tied by the qualified viters of the State. or appointed by ithe lioveruor -ith the advice and foot sent of twerthirdsof the Senate as the Legislature may provide: whose term of office. duties and satary shat be preseribed by Liw: in which dopartment there shall be established by the Lezislature a bureau of labor, when required by the publie interest.
Ske. 2. The Governor of this State is heieby directed to issue and have published the neeusaary proclamation for the su mission of tais resolntion to the qualitied voters for memhers of the feg. islature of the State of Texas, as an amendment tothe Censtutation of Texas. tabe voted upon on the first Tuesdav in August, 1007. All parsons favoring said amendment sha!l hwe written or printed on their ballots. as follows: "For the amendment to the Cosstitution, providIjge For a Department of Agrieulturi- and a Bureau of Labor" And those opposed to sald amendment shall have written or printed an their ballots as follows: "Against the amendment to the Cyust1tation, proviting for a Department of Agrieulture and a Bareau òt Labor." - And the sum of ( $\$ 8000$ ) two thousand açlars or so much thereof as many be necessary is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the Treasurv of the state of Texas, not otherwise appropriated, to pay the expenses of such publications, proclamation and election.
