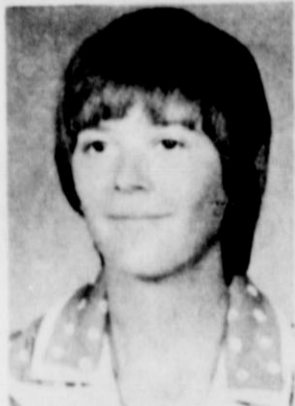

The contest consisted of the actual performance of skills in the fields of arc welding, electrification, and small gas engines. A fourth division was an identification test covering the tools and materials used in the three fields.

Jim Cooper tied for first place in arc welding with a score of 375 out of a possible 400. Chris Bolden and Louis Shorter tied for first place in the identification test with scores of 196 out of a possible 200. Abernathy was second and Happy won third in over-all team scores.

Stanley Allen Smith, 25, former Matador resident, was pronounced dead on arrival early Friday at Sunrise Hospital in Las Vegas, Nev., of head injuries received earlier that night. It was thought that head injuries received about two weeks earlier in an auto accident were a contributing factor in the death.

Funeral services were held at 3:00 p.m. Wednesday, at the Methodist Church in Dumont, Texas with Rev. Gene Joplin of Plainview, former pastor of the Matador First Baptist Church, and Rev. Henry Salley, pastor of the Paducah and Dumont Methodist Churches, officiating.

Interment was in Dumont Cemetery under the direction of Seigler Funeral Home of Matador.

Mr. Smith was born November 5, 1951, at Matador, and passed away, May 13, 1977. He lived in the Dumont community for a number of years and later moved to Matador with his parents. He entered the Air Force in 1972 and served until 1976. He had been living in Las Vegas for about three months, where he was attending a vocational school studying heating and air conditioning installation and service.

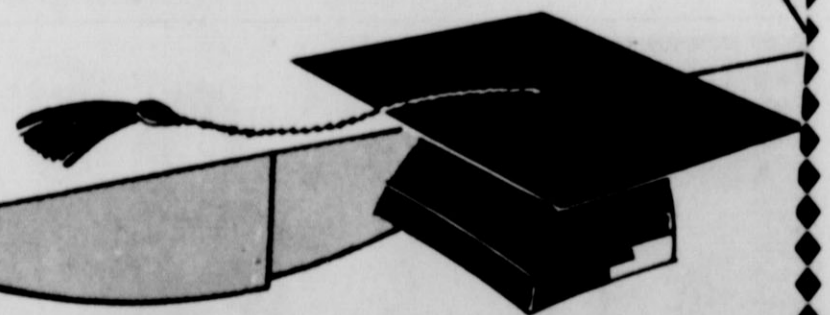

## Wall Street Journal Feature Recommended

An article by Karen Elliott House in a recent issue of the Wall Street Journal has been suggested as recommended reading, and perhaps even required reading for "every citizen who believes in private enterprise."

In the April 14 issue of Livestock Weekly, published in San Angelo, a column headed, "Unregistered Bull in a Hotel Lobby," by Stanley Frank, Editor and publisher comments:

"Millions of private citizens complain about the incredible cost of our bureaucracy, and Jimmy Carter ran on a platform full of promises to do something about it, but the sickening truth is that bloated and steadily expanding government agencies may have become so big that nobody can bring them back to reasonable size and efficiency."

"An example is the Agriculture Department. The April 12 issue of The Wall Street Journal carried a Page 1 story on it by a staff writer Karen Elliott House. It is recommended reading. Perhaps it should be required reading for every citizen who believes in private enterprise and a day's work in return for a day's pay. . . . Though the article about the USDA is rather lengthy, it is far from tedious."
