

"Millions of private citizens complain about the incredible cost of our bureaucracy, and Jimmy Carter ran on a platform full of promises to do something about it, but the sickening truth is that bloated and steadily expanding government agencies may have become so big that nobody can bring them back to reasonable size and

'An example is the Agriculture Department. The April 12 issue of The Wall Street Journal carried a Page 1 story on it by a staff writer Karen Elliott House. It is recommended reading. Perhaps it should be required reading for every citizen who believes in private enterprise and a day's work in return for a day's pay . . .
