### Co-operative Shipment

A pool for the selling of all the turkeys and chickens that are for sale is now being formed. It is thought that by getting all the poultry that will be for sale between now and the middle of November in one lot and advertising what we have, with all the large poultry produce houses and selling to the highest bidder, that a much better price can be obtained than by the individual owners selling one at a time. It is expected that a car of turkeys can be secured in the country and if not an entire load, then la mixed car of turkeys and chickens can be secured. The advantage of this is that where only a few are sold at a time, the shipment must be made by express, which is some higher than by freight.
