

SUPPLY OF TIMBER ASSURED

Proper Management, Cocus D'Alene National Forest Can Furnish Millions of Feet Yearly.

Fifty million feet of sawlogs can be removed annually for all time from Coeur d'Alene national forest Idahe, according to the prescriptions of the management plan approved by the forest service, United States De partment of Agriculture.

The net area of forest is about 660, 1000 acres, of which about 550,000 acres is considered as productive forest land The great share of the timber, at usued, is in two age classes, the mature and overmature class and the very young, 0 to 20-year, class.

The main problem of management is that of making the mature timber last for a sufficient period to enable the youngest and intermediate classes to ach maturity. This average period its estimated at 80 years, during which time a total of 4,000,000,000 feet will oved, or an average of 50,000, feet per year.
