Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt president of the International Equal Suffrage association, has a theory tout men are more emotional than women, in illustration of which she tells the following story, according to the New York Sun:

"I once visited a small village in New England which was bordered by a small river, so that farmers coming into the village from either way had to ford the stream.





Many a field which started off poorly has developed wonderfully of late and farmers are urgged to select any five acres out of thier cotton field and enter them in the State

It does not matter what shape the field is in. If a check or ditch runds through the field that will make no difference as land on both sides can be measured just so that there are five acres, on more; no less.

All land must be measured by August 1. The measuring committee should consist of two fromers living in the community or county with the entrants and one merchant or business man from the nearest town. Large counties with many entrants may appoint as many measuring committees as may be necessary to divide the work. Affidavits can be obtained at all Chambers of Commerce and County Agtens or from the Agricultural Editor of the Dallas Morning News and The Semi-Weekly Farm News.


