

All contributions to be sent to Dean Shelby of the University of Texas.

To Seek Funds That the legislature be asked to provide funds for the teaching of graduate work in the Prairie View State Teachers College for women.

That a committee be appointed to recommend better standards of cleanliness, sanitation and health on school busses.

That the legislature be asked to provide easier means of enlarging school districts thus enabling the school to operate in larger units and to make school taxes more uniform.


