New Plan Offered To Buy War Bonds

"Farmers and ranchers are called upon the unstinting cooperation and sacrifice in furnishing necessary food and fibre for the war and helping to finance it," said Ralph Howe, secretary and treasurer of the Memphis Production Credit Association, Monday in announcing organization plans for doing a bigger job of buying War Bonds.

A "Victory Club" has been started by the Memphis Production Credit Association to enlist its members in a drive to set aside certain calves, pigs, lambs, cotton acreages or other agriculture production to be invested in War Bonds. There are no other requirements, Howe said.

Although sponsored by the P. C. A., membership in the club is open to all farmers and ranchmen in this territory. More than one member of a family may join. Enrollment blanks were sent this week to the 525 members, Howe said, but any person interested who did not receive one may obtain a blank from the Production Credit Association office in Matador.

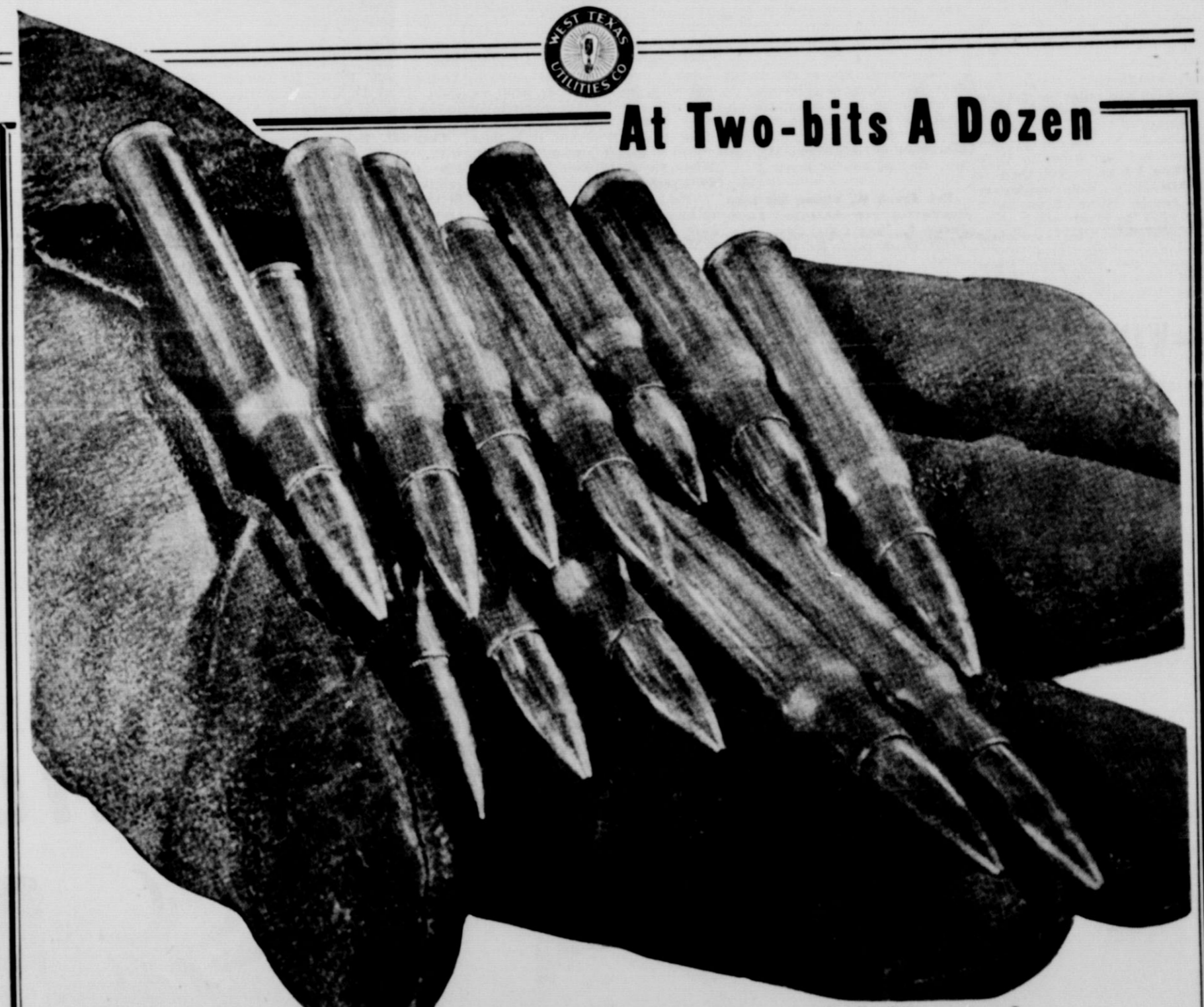
