#### SPRINGS HONORED ANAH REUNION

Oct. 24—Mr. and Mrs. J. T. Parker of Roaring Springs Sunday at an all-day reunion of the family at the home of M. Holt, with a picnic on the lawn of the home.

Mr. and Mrs. Holt have 47 living children, which includes six grandchildren, and 100 nephews and nieces. This is the first reunion of the family to have been together since the late 1800s.

Mr. Holt was born in Tarrant County, Texas, and drifted west to Roaring Springs in 1877 where he was employed as a cowboy. In 1885 he married Miss Nettie, daughter of a prominent family near Albany, Mo.

Mr. Holt was familiar with the range many years ago and was employed by R. Good and Son of Hardeman County, Texas.

Mrs. J. T. Parker, wife of the late J. T. Parker, died in Roaring Springs, Texas, on Oct. 20, 1933, at the age of 72 years.

#### DISTINGUISHED GUESTS OF TEXAS

Probably no national official has given himself into the hearts of Texas more than did Postmaster General James A. Farley who with other high officials made a tour of Texas last week.

Mr. Farley is an outstanding figure of the nation today and his work as Postmaster General will live long after his term of office shall have expired.

Silliman Evans is a Texan in the Post Office Department. Vice President Garner was the chief figure in the reception committee and he and Mr. Farley were the main speakers at a banquet held at the Adolphus hotel in Dallas last Thursday evening.

#### TEXAS PIONEER DIES AT WICHITA FALLS SAT.

J. W. Miller, former citizen of Motley County and father of Mrs. C. H. McCulley of Spur, died at Wichita Falls early Saturday morning. Funeral services were held at Wichita Falls Saturday afternoon at 4:30 o'clock. The body arrived at Matador Sunday where another service was conducted by Rev. Joe E. Boyd, pastor of the First Methodist Church of Spur, at 3:30 o'clock. Interment followed in Matador cemetery.

Mr. Miller was a victim of influenza last Christmas and never was able to build up from the effects of it. About August he began failing in health and went to Wichita Falls where he thought he could secure better medical attention.

He was a native of North Carolina and was born at Charlotte September 2, 1863. He came to Texas when about 18 years of age and settled at Gainesville. Later he came to Childress where he worked on a ranch.

During his days on the ranch he became acquainted with W. L. Hyatt, Johnny Harrington, W. R. Stafford and the late W. C. Presley, all of Spur.

About 1890 he moved to Motley County where he made his home many years. In 1891 he married Miss Annie Damron who lived near Matador. At that time there was no means of transportation except the wagon. Most everything was freighted from Quanah and later from Childress.

#### Stranger Dies Of Injuries Received Monday Morning

#### EXACT DETAILS FATAL ACCIDENT ARE UNKNOWN

After throwing his meager bundle of earthly belongings aboard the trailer of a moving truck, which had slowed to pick him up, a man later identified as B. Pettit, in some unknown manner fell to receive fatal injuries on Highway 18 a short distance out of Roaring Springs about 9 o'clock Monday morning.

He was immediately rushed to Dr. J. F. Hughes' office for medical treatment. Examination revealed that he suffered concussion of the brain of which he died Monday afternoon without regaining consciousness.

The only means of identification available was the signature of B. Pettit by which he had registered at the Williams rooming house the night before. He was believed to be about 45 years of age.

Interment was made in the Roaring Springs cemetery Tuesday afternoon.

You are Hereby Commanded to summon Clara B. Thorckmorton by making publication of this Citation once in each week for four consecutive weeks previous to the return day hereof, in some newspaper published in your county, to appear at the next regular term of the District Court of Motley County, to be holden at the Court House thereof, in Matador, on the 2nd Monday in November A. D. 1933, the same being the 14th day of November A. D. 1933, then and there to answer a petition filed in said Court on the 9th day of October A. D. 1933, in a suit, numbered on the docket of said Court as No. 883, wherein A. L. Thorckmorton, is Plaintiff and Clara B. 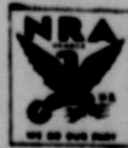
