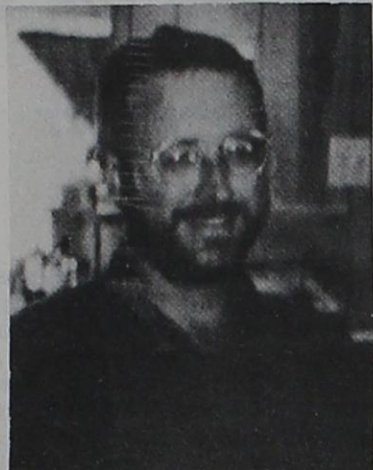

Pete Laney Day!

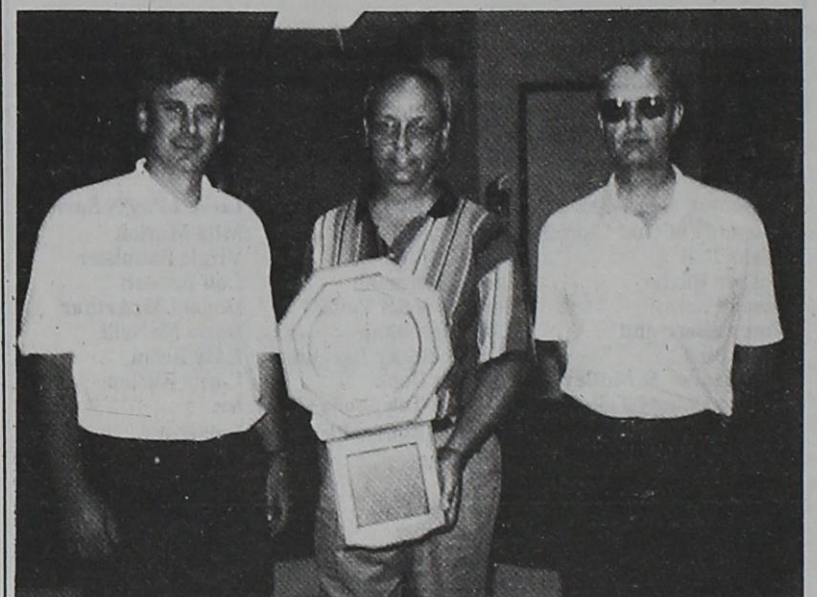

Rick Copp, Superintendent of Motley County I.S.D., received an unexpected gift from the Region 17 Education Service Center of Lubbock on Thursday, July 11.

Kyle Margo, Executive Director, from Region 17 ESC presented Motley County I.S.D. a Daniel Dakota quartz wall clock. The clock was presented to the school as an appreciation gift for the money given to the service center as a result of the weighted average daily attendance funds received from Jayton. The dollars received from Motley County I.S.D. and other schools was used by the service center to help

build the new conference rooms located at the center.

The education service center is a vital part of Motley County I.S.D. They furnish support services for teachers through inservice programs and supply the school with countless hours of help with finances and other educational service matters.

Motley County School Board Meets

The Motley County ISD Board of Trustees met Monday, July 8 at 7:30 p.m. Roll was called by Superintendent Rick Copp, who was officially hired as the new Superintendent June 26.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved. The board also approved a list of expenditures and reviewed the financial statement. TASB Update 51 supplements were approved. Lunchroom prices for 1996-97 were set.

The Board approved advertising for bids for gasoline and diesel, L.P.G., Milk, Bread, Fleet Insurance, and Property/General Liability Insurance with an August 14 deadline.

Mr. Copp was appointed integrated Pest Management (IPM) and authorized representative for the food service.

The board discussed Mrs. Baird's Chapter 11 Bankruptcy and decided not to pursue the issue.

At this time the Board went into Executive Session.

Out of executive session, Wayne Moren was hired as Principal and Tanya Price was hired as 3rd grade teacher.

Meeting adjourned.
