This was the heading on a little essay somebody left on our desk.
We suggest you clip it out and show it to people who complain about meat prices.
If the price of choice steers had gone up as fast since 1950 as the price of a first-class postage stamp, steers would be bringing \$77 per hundred.
If beef prices had increased as much as medical care, steers would be selling for \$72.34.
If the rise had been as fast as hourly pay, the figure would be \$80.60.
Compared to the cost of having a baby, steers would be bringing \$119.13.
Compared to the daily cost of hospital service, steers would bring \$179.69.
And if that is not sufficient to curl your lasso, the live cattle price in Europe at the beginning of 1973 averaged \$56 per hundred.
