Kim Hand will give the Salutatory address, then she will play a piano selection.

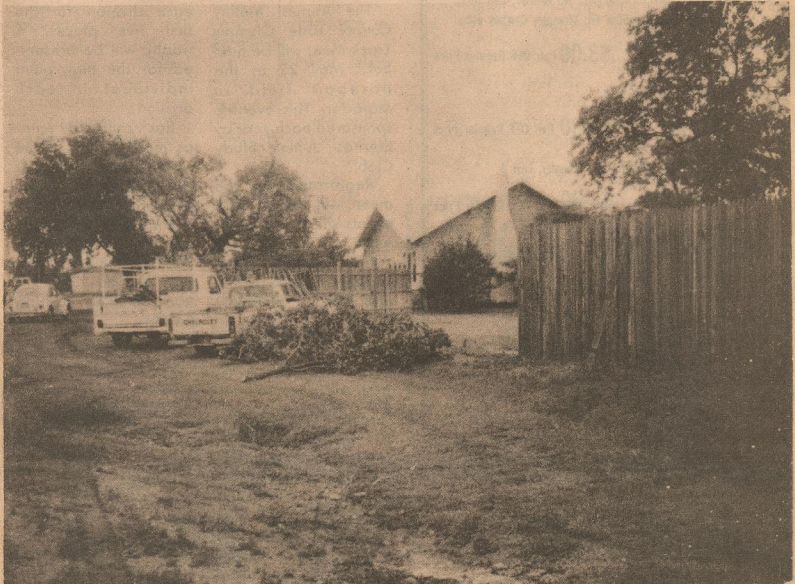

Funnel Cloud Forms Sunday Gives City A Close Call

Matador has a close call Sunday evening when a funnel cloud formed suddenly at the western city limits and dipped low enough to tear down fences, trees and rip off part of a shed roof and tear off shingles from houses. The funnel formed at Texas Highway 70 at about 7:50 p.m. and caused damage at the homes of Bennie Keltz, Kenny Barton, Danny James, George H-Gland, Ted Green, and at the Motley County School.

Earlier in the day, at approximately 5 p.m., the first of three storms rumbled through Motley County. From golfball to baseball size hail fell south of Matador and reached parts of Roaring Springs. There were some reports that hail as large as a softball fell near Roaring Springs.

"This was about 7:20 p.m." Williams said. "It stayed on the ground about two minutes. No damage was reported there."

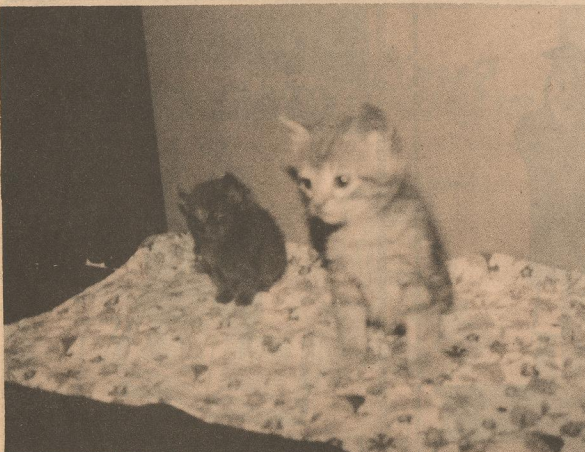

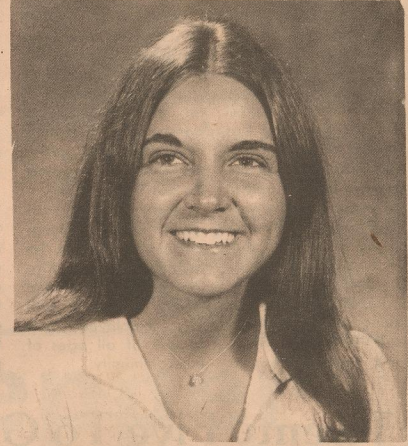

Cloyd of Flomot and Mrs. Bessie McLaren of St. Charles, Louisiana; 13 grandchildren and 15 great-grandchildren.

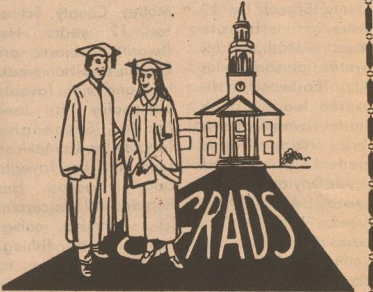
