

The Chrismon Tree originated in the Evangelican Lutheran Church of the Ascension in Danville, Virginia in 1957. From that beginning the idea has spread to Christians all over the world.

The evergreen tree, which symbolizes the eternal life which our Savior has won for us, is a background for tiny white lights and white and gold Chrismons. The lights speak of Him Who is the Light of the world, and the Christ.

MONogram) proclaim the Name, the Life, and the saving Acts of Jesus the Christ.

Some Chrismons are simple copies of symbols

combinations of several elements, old and new. All of the Chrismons are made in either white or gold or in a combination of the two colors.

WHITE, the Liturgical color for Christmas, suggests the innocence, purity, and perfection of our Savior. In our culture, it is the color of joy. Scripture often uses white to portray purity and equates it with light to denote completeness.

GOLD, as a symbol for the glory and majesty of God and the Son of God, is also derived from Biblical usage. For empahsis, certain Chrismons show a touch of RED to remind us of the blood of Christ by which we are saved.
