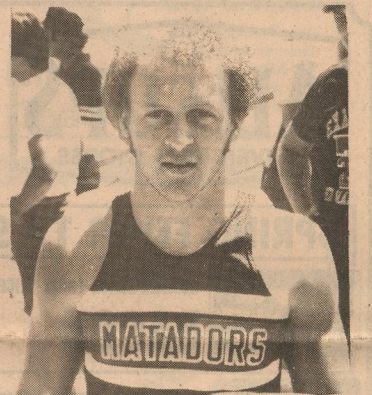
8th Grade Commencement Set For Friday, May 20th

Annual awards banquet Friday night, May 13 for the Motley County Chapter of Future Farmers of America held a surprise for Advisor Bill Moss, Vo-Ag teacher, when he was presented a

plaque by the Motley County Livestock Association. The plaque was in recognition and appreciation for Mr. Moss's 36 years here as Vo-Ag instructor.

Following a barbe-

cue supper at the school cafeteria, FFA officers presided at their respective posts for the opening ceremony, and were in charge of the program.

Invocation was by John D. Russell. Bill Luckett, president, introduced the Chapter Sweetheart, Miss Deann Phillips, and Honorary members and wives were introduced by Kody Hardin, sentinel.

Mothers and Dads were recognized by Craig Turner, reporter, and John Meador, treasurer, recognized the High School faculty. School Board members and their spouses were introduced by Cris Gwinn, acting secretary for Roy Thompson, secretary, and James Hal Bearden, acting for vice-president Terry Simpson, introduced special guests.

Recognition of Teams and presentation of awards was by Advisor Moss, who announced that the Greenhand Chapter Conducting

team had placed first in the Plainview District. Members of the Livestock Judging, Dairy Cattle Judging and General Agriculture Mechanics Shop teams were recognized, and the following individual awards presented: Brandt Bearden, Beef Production; Bill Luckett, Swine Production; Craig Turner, Crop Production; Bill Luckett and Lotus Winn, Ag-Mechanics, Luckett scoring high in electricity with 296 points out of a possible 400 points, and Winn receiving high with 191.5 in tool identification, and winning easily over 2nd place winner who scored 178.5 points. These contests were held at Texas Tech.

Paul Block received the Star Greenhand award, and Craig Turner, the Star Chapter Farmer award. Bill Luckett was recipient of the DeKalb award, deemed the most prestigious of all Vo-Ag honors.

Bill Luckett, son of Mr. and Mrs. Carter Luckett recently was named winner of the 1983 DeKalb Agricultural Accomplishment Award. The award, sponsored nationwide by DeKalb AgResearch, Inc., is presented to the senior agriculture student attaining the highest degree of proficiency in scholarship, leadership, and a supervised agricultural program.

Announcement was made Friday evening at the annual Motley

County FFA Chapter Banquet, by Bill Moss, Vo-Ag teacher and Chapter Advisor.

Bill has served as President of the Motley County Chapter of Future Farmers of America; and Vice-President of both the Senior Class and National Honor Society this year. He was a member of the third place Shop team in the Texas Tech Farm Mechanics Contest and was high individual in the Electrical wiring

section of the Plainview District section in the Tech contest. His agricultural program consists of cotton and swine. Following graduation, Bill plans to attend South Plains College, Levelland, and major in Petroleum Technology.

As this year's DeKalb Agricultural Accomplishment Award winner, Bill receives a pin and certificate, and his name will be inscribed on a special plaque displayed in the

vocational agriculture classroom. The award, often considered the highest honor a vo-ag student can receive on the local level, is presented in more than 4,000 schools annually.

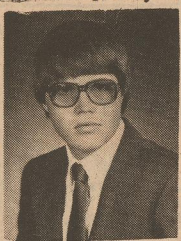

Randy's hobbies include hunting, swimming and fishing. Randy plans to attend Tread School, TSTI in Fort Worth.

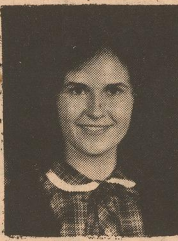

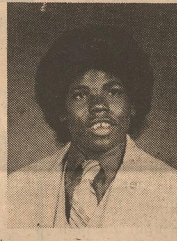

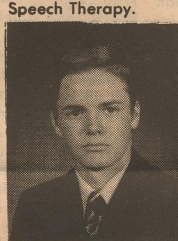
Clayton Lyndell Sims
