## El Progreso Club Has Christmas Tea

his wife wrote a biography of him, entitled 'A Man Called Peter.'"

The customs and traditions which have been handed down through the generations are drawn in contrast to the true symbols of Christmas, such as the star, the manger, the wise men and the shepherds, as the author follows the central theme of "keeping Christmas."

"So we will not 'spend' Christmas nor 'observe' Christmas (he writes). We will 'keep' Christmas—keep it as it is...in all the loveliness of its ancient traditions. May we keep it in our hearts, that it may be kept in its hope."

Favorite Christmas carols were led by Mrs. R.E. Campbell Jr., with accompaniment by Mrs.

Pohl, and Mrs. Vinson concluded the program with an Inspirational Thought from Helen Steiner Rice titled "Teach Us To Live."

A tea committee composed of Mesdames Ted Elliott, J.E. Edwards and Bill Pipkin, assisted by Mrs. O.W. Overstreet, served refreshments of Christmas candies, pinwheels, cakes, petits fours, cookies, mints and nuts, with coffee and hot spiced tea, with Mrs. Hamilton presiding at the silver service.

A Christmas runner down the length of the table, was centered with a ceramic, lighted tree flanked by green candles in crystal holders in nests of greenery, red berries and fruit ornaments.

## DPS Gives Advice On Preventing Crime

It is the season to be joyfull, but many Texans will find the holiday season to be less than jolly, according to Major V.J. Cawthon, Regional Commander of the Texas Department of Public Safety.

Three things are almost certain to be a part of the season: homes and apts. will be filled with gifts; families taking trips to be with loved ones; and the crime rate goes up.

Major Cawthon offered the following suggestions as precautions you can and should take to avoid turning the joyous time into an unpleasant memory.

Make sure you keep all doors and windows locked, even though you may be at home. Do not make your affluence known. If your Christmas tree is placed in front of a window, be sure the gifts are not easily visible from the outside.

If your holiday plans include a trip, have home deliveries stopped and ask a friend or neighbor to look after your home. Allow plenty of time to get to your destination and take a break every two hours to avoid fatigue. Above all, do not mix alcohol and driving. Do not leave packages on the seats or in plain view. Put gifts and luggage in the trunk, safely out of sight.

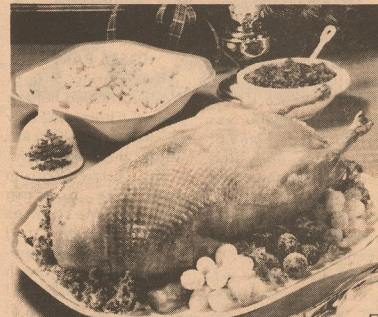
Robbery also increases during the holiday season and there are some things you can do to avoid becoming a victim. Do not show large amounts of cash

## Succulent Christmas Goose This Year Order Early - Order Now



Every year we read about the succulent roast goose served by Mrs. Cratchit in Dickens' *Christmas Carol*. This year, why not serve one? It is unexpected holiday excitement that will fill your family with Victorian Christmas glow.

Today's best goose is well-bred, frozen and should have a USDA Grade A inspection seal on the package. Look for it. It means the bird is far meatier, far less fatty, and time and work saving since it is obligingly self-basting. Order yours at once to ensure you have it in plenty of time for the holidays.

Thaw bird according to package instructions. Follow the table below for correct roasting times. If you cook the bird unstuffed, cooking time will be slightly shortened.

### APRICOT-WALNUT STUFFING

- 1 cup (1-lb. 1-oz.) chopped walnuts
- 1/2 cup golden raisins
- 1/4 cup butter or margarine, melted
- 1/2 teaspoon poultry seasoning
- 6 cups day-old bread, cubed
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper

Dice apricots. In bowl, pour melted butter or margarine over bread cubes. Combine with apricots and all remaining ingredients. Toss lightly to mix well. Makes enough stuffing for a 10 to 12 pound goose.

## Rewards And Bonuses Are Taxable Income

Taxpayers who were fortunate enough to earn awards or bonuses this year are being reminded by IRS that these amounts should be included as income on their 1983 federal income tax returns.

The IRS says rewards and bonuses include prizes such as a paid vacation trip awarded for attaining sales goals. If the prize or award is in the form of goods or services, its fair market value is the amount the taxpayer must include as income.

If the employer pays the bonus or award at a future time, it is not taxable until it is received by the

employee, the IRS says.

If an employer distributes holiday remembrances such as turkeys, hams, or other items of nominal worth, the value of these gifts is not taxable. However, if cash, gift certificates or similar items that may be easily exchanged for cash are given, the value of the gifts is taxable.

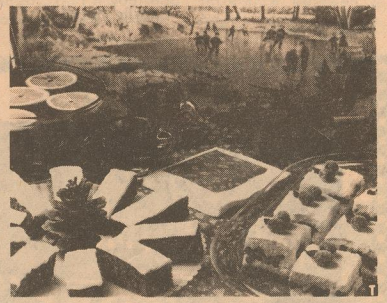

  - 1 package (3 ounces) cream cheese, softened
  - 2 1/4 cups powdered sugar
- Mix lemon peel, lemon juice, milk and cream cheese in small bowl. Gradually beat in powdered sugar until frosting is smooth and of spreading consistency.

#### FROZEN CRANBERRY CHEESECAKE

- 1 1/2 cups vanilla wafer crumbs
- 1/4 cup margarine or butter, melted



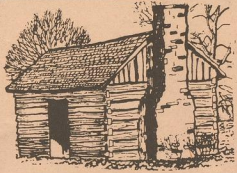

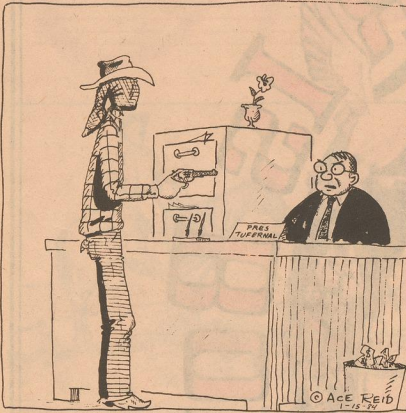
