YOU ARE HEREBY COMMANDED to appear before the Honorable District Court of Motley County at the Courthouse thereof, in Matador, Texas, by filing a written answer at or before 10 o'clock A.M. of the first Monday next after the expiration of forty-two days from the date of the issuance of this citation, same being the 28th day of July A.D. 1971, to Petitioner's Petition filed in said court, on the 1st day of June A.D. 1971, in this cause, numbered 1775 on the docket of said court and styled BENITA L. MIRONDA, Petitioner, vs. RAYMOND MIRONDA, Respondent.

A brief statement of the nature of this suit is as follows, to-wit: * Petitioner sues for divorce alleging that she was married to respondent on July 15, 1968, and separated from him on or about August 15, 1969; that she has resided in the State of Texas for more than 12 months and in Motley County for more than 6 months before filing her suit; that the marriage relationship between petitioner and respondent has become insupportable because of discord between them that destroys the legitimate ends of the marriage relationship and prevents any reasonable expectation of reconciliation; that no children were born of said marriage and no property acquired, and asking that petitioner's maiden name of Benita L. Zarate be restored to her; as is more fully shown by Plaintiff's Petition on file in this suit.

If this citation is not served within ninety days after the date of its issuance, it shall be returned unserved.

The officer executing this writ shall promptly serve the same according to requirements of law and the mandates hereof, and make due return as the law directs.
