EXTENSION H. E. STUDY GROUP ORGANIZED IN MOTLEY COUNTY

The first meeting of the Motley County Extension Home Economics Study Group met Wednesday, December 19, in Matador, at the Methodist Church. Mrs. W. C. Pallmeyer presented the program on cake decorating.

This newly organized study group is supported by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service and is open to all homemakers regardless of race, color, creed, or national origin. It is based on organization similar to a Home Demonstration Club but is less formal, with no elected officers. Each meeting will be conducted by a volunteer leader.

A planning meeting was held earlier with members of the Study Group and Miss Pam Wallace, Assistant

County Extension Agent-at-Large setting up dates and coordinating programs. STUDIES ABOUT THE BIBLE

What is the basis for New Testament authority? Heb. 1:1-2. God, after He spoke long ago to the fathers in the prophets in many portions and in many ways, in these last days has spoken to us in His Son...

The "last days" began during Paul's lifetime. We are still in those "last days." But God does not contact man in "many ways" now as in times past. Today He speaks to mankind in only one way -- by His Son.

Paul states this in another way, Rom. 1:16. For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes... Here Paul refers to the gospel of Christ. This phrase -- gospel of Christ -- is found several times in the New Testament: Mk. 1:1, I Cor. 1:1, II Cor. 4:4, etc. So Christ's gospel is the line of communication between God and man today.

How did this gospel reach us? John 14:10. "Do you not believe that I am in the Father, and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own initiative, but the Father abiding in Me does His works..." Also v. 16. "And I will ask the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may be with you forever; that is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive..." Again, v. 26. "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you..."

By these verses we learn that God sent the gospel message to the Apostles in the person of the Holy Spirit and by the authority of the Lord Jesus Christ, God, Christ, and the Holy Spirit. Can there ever be greater force behind a document? Truly, there is power for the salvation of man in the gospel of Christ.
