Harding Urges Settlement

Washington, March 6 .- President Harding has informed officials of the railway shoperafts that he can see no "adequate question of principle" which warrants a further delay in settlement in all districts of last summer's shop-

In a letter written just before he left Washington for Florida and made public today at the White House, the president declared that minority of intercets involved by their refusal to settle were "largely responsible" for interrupted coal deliveries and other unsatisfactory railway conditions in certain parts of the country.

The total number of men still out over the country has been a matter of dispute, but officials of the International Machinists Union estimated to day that about forty per cent of the men who went on strike July 1 have not yet returned.

The president's letter was in response to one from Stephen Conner, secretary of the federated shoperafts. Central Railroad of New Jersey and was as follows:

"Your letter of March 3 comes to hand just as I am about leaving for the south, but I am glad of the opportunity it affords me to express my sentiment on the subject. You tell me that the shopcrafts of the New Jersey Central railroad are staging a relief fund movement, and ask me to send my autographed photograph. I am gladly

complying. "It is an occasion of intense regret that the settlement of the shopcrafts strike which has been effected on the larger part of the railroad systems and the mileage of the country, has not been found possible on all the rest. I do not find myself able to discern any adequate question of principle which uld justify a minority of the inter ests involved in this distressing situation in refusing to make settlements similar to those which have been made by the majority. The information which reaches me brings the conviction that continued failure to make settlement is largely responsible for unfortunate conditions as to railroad move ments in some areas and for interrupted deliveries of coal during the winter months, with resultant suffering in many communities and much demoralization to industry. It is a situation which seems certain to become more, serious unless effective measures are found for early amelioration."



A costly failure, did you say. No. not at all. The cost of nuts and labor were not over fifty dollars, or about fifty cents per acre, and the experience I gained has been four times this much. But had it been budded trees at the low cost of fifty cents a tree, aggregating a cost of \$2,000 or more. it would have been costly, and the failare even worse under the same condi-

This is one reason why I advocate and plant the nuts in preference to builded trees. If you fail, the loss is small, and if you succeed the profits will be as great in ten years time as if you planted budded trees, if properly managed and with an initial cost nearly 100 to 1 cheaper. This difference in initial cost alone is sufficient reason for planting unts in preference to the costly trees. Many a hard pressed farmer, to make both financial ends meet, who has suitable pecan land, can spare fifty cents per acre to plant ten acres or more, who could not afford nor think of buying budded trees at a cost of \$25 to \$50 per acre. And, by the way, I wish to say right here that I do not mean creek or river bottom land by using the word "suitable," but it includes any upland, miles from any stream, which has a clay foundation. In fact, I prefer such upland to bottom land, but cannot prolong this article to give my reason for



Good Cows Saved the Day for Him (By E. M. HARMON,

in the Dairy Farmer.)

"What did you buy that old worn out flat for, Mac. It is too poor to even deserve to be called a farm?"

"I know," came the reply, "but it is all that I can afford. Besides the lo cation is fine and with some good cows I'll make a farm out of it."

This is the subsequence of a conversation which occurred in a small southwest Missouri town about ten years ago. A. J. McDowell had just purchased an almost worthless old wornout farm near Fordland, Missouri. It was generally known throughout the community that no one could make a living on that farm. Everyone who tried it was obliged to move within a few years.

Mr. McDowell had lived in this same county most of his life and had always been credited with having eyen more than ordinary judgment. What had happened that he should decide to move on that worthless piece of dirt? The whole community was puzzled. Some of them were sure that he was losing his mind. And all of them were sure that he would have to leave that farm within the next few years. They thought that no one could make a decent living on it.

But McDowell has some ideas of his own that he was determined to try. As he said he had very little money to start on. That was the reason he had to buy the run down farm.

He had to start everything in a small way. A lawyer by profession, he had lost his health and had spent practically all of his life's savings to regain it. He could not return to the bar. He needed some outdoor life and his observations in other sections had taught him that the business-like dairymen usually came out on top.

McDowell's only response was to bora little later he bought three purebred females. At that time only a small part of his farm was in cultivation, most of it having been let go back to brush. It is seven years now since those three purebred females went on to the McDowell farm. Since that time he has purchased three herd bulls but has never bought any more females. He now has twenty-one head of registered females on the farm and these are gradually replacing the grade herd. He has two herd bulls, one a grandson of King of the Pontiacs and the other a grandson of Fobes Mutual Longfield,


