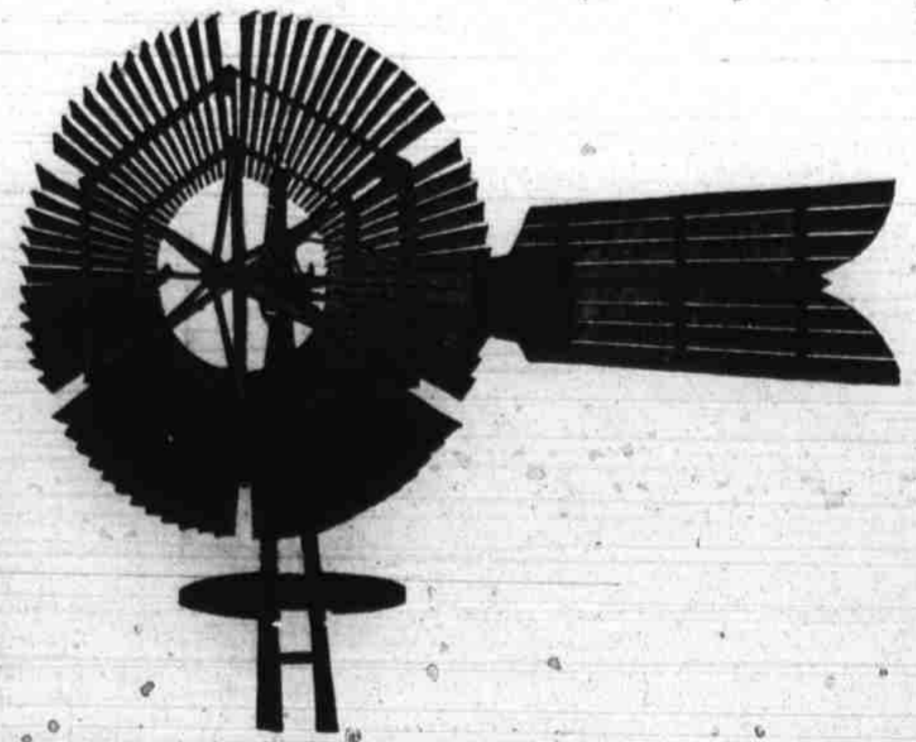

The Election.

The election to select delegates to the Democratic National Convention which was held Saturday passed off very quietly here. A very light vote was polled in this county, a total of 564 being cast. The Bailey ticket receiving 285 and the opposition 279 votes.

There were 958 poll tax receipts issued for the year 1907, and with the exemptions probably run the vote up to something over 1000 for the county.

The vote over the entire State was very light, some counties not holding any election. It is conceded to the Bailey ticket by about 20,000 majority.

A report has been sent out from Austin that Judge Wm Poindexter of Cleburne will be a candidate for governor.

The supporters of the Senator claimed the county would be for him by three to one. We consider the showing made by the opposition to the Bailey ticket a good one in view of the fact

that no campaign was made and very little literature was used.
