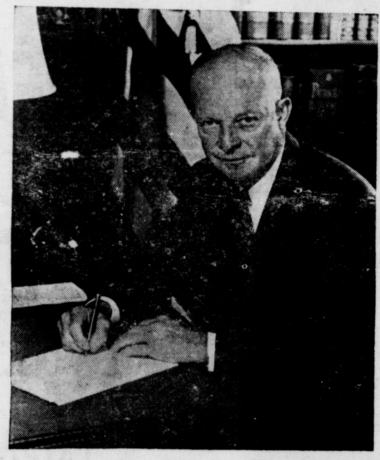

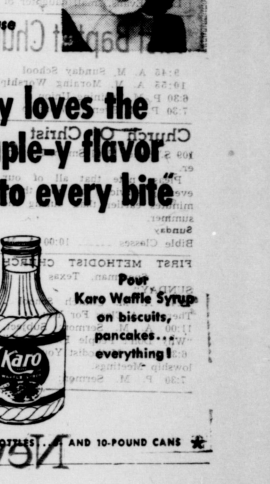

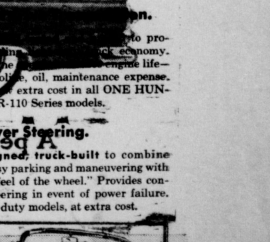

When To Defrost Your Home Food Freezer

College Station, Oct. — When your home food freezer needs defrosting, don't put the big job off. A clean box actually leads to more economical operation and longer life of the unit.

It's difficult to set a regular schedule so defrost when the size of the box becomes frosted with one-half inch of ice or more, says Roy W. Snyder, extension meat specialist.

Snyder explains that ice acts as a blanket over the refrigerator coils. The heavier the coating, the longer the machinery must

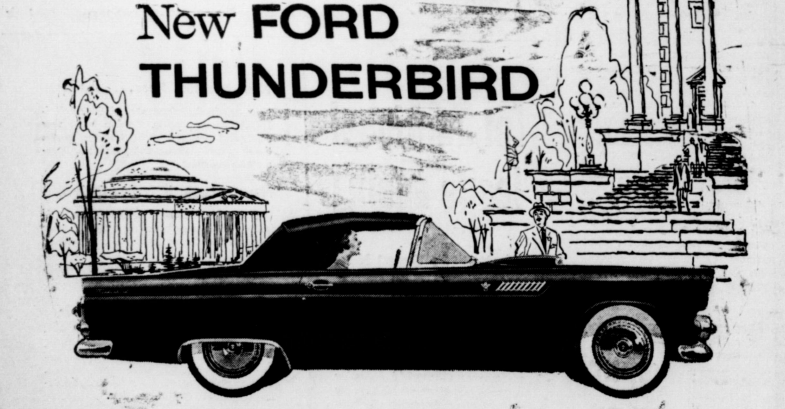

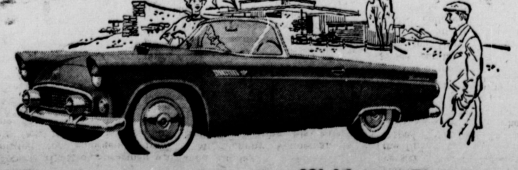
