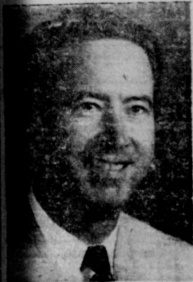
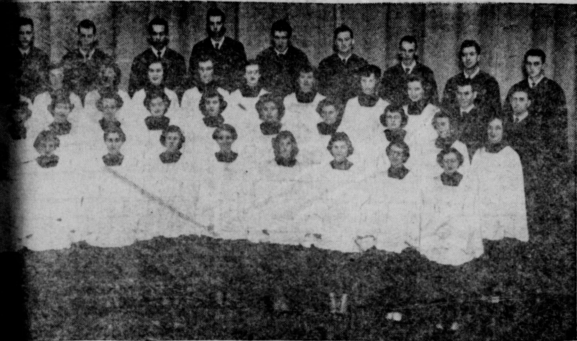

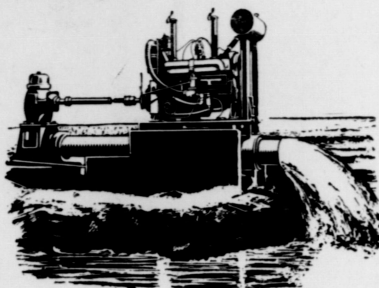

Do you know how much grain sorghum seed you will need this Spring? If you can estimate this need, it may be a good idea to see your dealer right away. This will give him a chance to get stocked with the right seed. Roy Chase is already looking for some Redbine 66.

More people are talking about silage—a good sign. Time is slipping by and it won't be long till planting time. Bob Greene is sorta thinking about silage this year. He says the good thing about silage is that a crop can be put in the silo at any stage during its growth. So if you run out of moisture—cut the crop and cram it into silo.
You sure missed something if you did not hear that radio program on Bindweed that came out of Guyton a couple of Sundays ago. Bindweed plots of a third of an acre or less can be exterminated by use of a good soil sterilizer.
Bindweeds spread rapidly and once you get em scattered around you have to live with them from now on. You would blow away if you tried to sterilize large acreages, and the only thing left is to spray. Spray will only control them not kill them.
Some of your local feed and seed stores and implement dealers handle the dope to treat the weed and if you go through the right channels, the government will pay about half the cost of material.
L. W. Rosenbaum just acquired some rabbits. They are multiplying so fast that they

are eating him out of house and home. L. W. says the way to count em is to count their ears and divide by two. Your county agent does not have these troubles. He has not had the pattern of little feet—rabbits that is—and he has had a doe for about six months.
The county 4-H tour of the Amarillo Air Base is due this Saturday. From all indications, more cars will be needed, so if you want to see the base, contact the County Agent or the Home Demonstration Agent before 8:00 a. m. Saturday.
Charlie Warner from the Borger employment office was
