Frank Novak Farm Sold

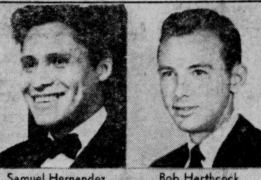

Bond Issue Carries In City Vote

Perhaps the citizenship of Spearman could not have expressed a more pronounced confidence to city officials than they did in the city bond election held Tuesday of this week. Voters went to the polls and voted 166 to 8 in favor of the \$130,000 bond issue to improve the city water works. The same voters voted 166 to 6 in favor of a \$20,000 bond issue to improve sewerage facilities of the city. The fine management of our city affairs deserve this outstanding vote of confidence. Largely speaking the management of city affairs has been in the same hands over a period of time that marked a bankrupt city treasury to the present time, when all the bonded indebtedness has been cleared and the city revenue is such that not only the needed improvements will be made, but other improvements such as street repairs, perhaps more paving, and additional insurance protection is in the schedule in the future.

While aggressive manager of
the local Chamber of Commerce,
Ex-Covboy Wilson Buchanan,
did not scoop us on every item
in his news bulletin to members
he did make a very impressive
news report. Some of the items
have been covered by stories in
the paper, ut we feel justified in
printing the news bulletin so
that the many readers of this
newspaper who are not members
of the C. of C., can get a chance
to read these items.
Here they are:
HOUSING
Mundy-Cooper Homes have
bought 18 of Marion Glover's
lots in the South part of town,
and will start building in the
next few days if present plans
develop.
Humble Oil Co. has started
construction on their camp.
Jimmie Crawford and E. C.
Greene are both building new
homes. The E. J. Copeland home
is near completion.
Mrs. Cillard, E. C. Greene,
Mrs. Mathews, John Bishop,
Frances Jones and Dave Hand
have moved houses into Spear-
man.
IRRIGATION
Irrigation wells are still being
drilled at a rapid rate in and
around Hansford County. We have
four wells drilling contractors
here in Spearman and every one

of them are behind in their work.
We are very fortunate in hav-
ing the greatest underground wa-
ter reservoir in the State under-
lying the best land. At the present
time we have not even scratched
the surface in the development of
our Country. Mr. O. F. Dent
of the State Board of Water En-
gineers stated the other day that
instead of 500 wells north of the
Canadian River that we now
have, we would have 5,000 wells
within the next five years. There
was an election Friday, January
21 which gave us local control of
the underground water.
The "Gas Irrigation" com-
mittee consisting of Ralph Blood-
gett, Ray Skinner, Joe Smith,
Hix Wilbanks, and Virgil Will-
banks met with a representative of
a Gas Pipe Line on January 5.
The line was to come out of
Shepherd County to Spearman for
Irrigation purposes. The price
was 30c per thousand cubic feet,
and the farmer would have to
come to the Gas Companies line.
The committee thought this was
a little too high as they have
several other prospective
sources in mind that they are
working on.

GAS AND OIL
Humble has developed another
good oil well on Harold Collier.
The Texas co. has two good
wells in Hutchinson County on
T. I. Harbour, and Lewis Buckner.
These wells are South of
Spearman about 12 miles.
The Shuple Oil Co. has a gas
well on Henry Ralston Section 19,
Block 2, S. A. and M. G. Sur-
vey. They have also staked a
location on H. L. Boyd Section 5,
Block 2, S. A. and M. G. Sur-
vey.

Sinclair Prairie has farmed out
J. I. Steele Section 57, Block
45, H. and T. C. to the producer
Chemico Co. and they are drill-
ing at the present time.
The Sun Oil Co. on R. P. Holt
Section 155, Block 45 H. and T. C.
have a small gas well, but are
still trying to develop it into
something better.
R. H. Fulton's well on Section
19, Block 2, W. C. Survey looks
like it will make a commercial
well.
The Cities Service well on G.
C. Brilliant well on Section 45,
Block 45, H. and T. C. has a
showing of gas, and they are
trying to develop it at the present
time.
The well on H. H. Crooks is
about down, and we should have
some reports on it in the near
future.
The information that we have
the Sinclair Well on J. I. Steele
is about the same as the Crooks
well.
The Oil activity is a little slow
now, but will pick up next
month, when the companies re-
lease their new locations.

Time To Treat Hardwoods
College Station, Jan.-Under-
standable hardwoods grow on a lot of
potentially productive Texas soil.
And, in many cases these trees
are draining moisture and plant
minerals needed for the production
of forage for livestock.
A. H. Walker, extension range
management specialist, says winter
is an ideal time to treat un-
wanted hardwoods and recom-
mends either 2, 4, 5-T or am-
mate for their control.
Two, 4, 5-T dissolved in diesel
oil or kerosene usually gives the
cheapest and most effective re-
sults. These chemicals are ap-
plied with a hand or back type
sprayer to the tree stump, trunk
or in frills.
The strength of solution de-
pends, says Walker, upon the
kind of trees and the method of
treatment. In central and east
Texas, one pound of 2, 4, 5-T
in nine gallons diesel oil applied
in frills has given economical
high percentage kills. Trunk and
stump treatments also give good
results if the solution is properly
mixed and applied.
Walker says recent studies
have shown that frill treatment

gives the best and cheapest re-
sults any time of year if the
treatment is thorough. The over-
lapping axe cut should com-
pletely encircle the tree. Trees
treated in the fall do not show
as high percentage kills as those
treated during the winter.
Winter, late spring and sum-
mer are the best seasons for in-
dividual tree treatment.
Walker suggests that inter-
ested farmers obtain from their
county agricultural agent copies
of circular C-330, "More Grass
From Controlling Hardwoods,"
or L-127, "Chemical Control of
Mesquite."

Results Of Buffelgrass Variety Tests On The Blackland
College Station, Jan.-Buffel-
grass strains T-4701 and TS-
35588 have given the highest
forage yields in three year tests
at the Blackland Agricultural
Experiment Station at Temple.
Of five strains observed from
1952 to 1954, T-4701 averaged
4,170 pounds of air-dry forage to
the acre per year and TS-
5588, 3905 pounds to the acre.
Another variety, TS-35585 yield
3,769 pounds and T-4464, the
most common commercial variety,
2,959 pounds of dry hay to the
acre per year.
The tests were begun to deter-
mine the adaptability of each
variety to the blackland area.
The grasses were seeded at rate
of two pounds per acre and fer-
tilized at planting with 60-60-0.

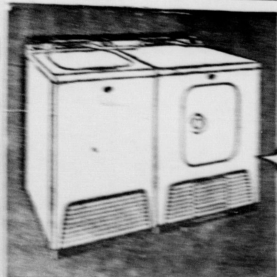

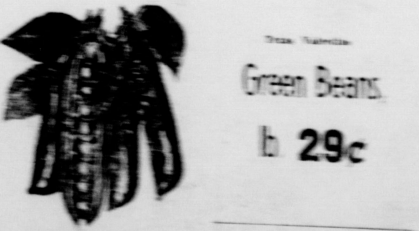
