### BOB WILLIS BIOGRAPHY

An American success story that began in the heart of Texas is that of Bob Willis, handsome, genial leader of the nation's No. 1 Western music aggregation.

Known as "Bob Willis and his Texas Playboys", this phenomenal dance band is coming to Spearman for 1 night engagement, on Wednesday, November 9th.

Bob was born and raised deep in the Lone Star State, in a small town in Hall County, West Texas. His childhood was that of a typical Texas youngster, riding his dad's horse and learning the songs of the wild and lonely plains.

When he was 19, he heard his cousin practicing on the violin. "He went over and over the same piece," Bob recalls. "I got tired of hearing it, I said, 'I'll be a pianist just like he is!'"

Much to his own surprise, Bob found that he could perform the unusual feat of playing a violin by ear. From then on, he determined to make music his career.

He practiced hard on his cousin's violin, finally acquired one of his own, and soon was playing on three Fort Worth radio stations.

Then he collected a guitar, and a singer and organized the "Light-Crust Doughboys", a trio which sold flour by the ton with their radio shows. That was in 1928.

By 1932, the Doughboys fan mail had soared to over 2,000 letters a day, about 1,700 of them coming from Oklahoma.

With a warm reception assured, Bob Willis moved to Tulsa. There his outfit increased to 25 members. They broadcast over KVOO for ten years, playing every note except two when floods prevented other appearances at the station.

Bob Willis and his boys became the pride and sensation of Tulsa. Their greatest annual triumphs were the rodeos called Bob Willis' Stampede, put on for six consecutive years featuring 500 riders and the best bucking horse available in the country.

Meanwhile Bob Willis' fame had caught Hollywood's attention, and in 1936 he costarred with Russell Hayden in a series of eight Columbia pictures. A parade of 1,100 men, women and children followed the rodeos called Bob Willis' Stampede, put on for six consecutive years featuring 500 riders and the best bucking horse available in the country.

Between film and radio and theatre engagement, Bob Willis was busy writing songs. His San Antonio Rose, recorded by Columbia, has gone over three and a half million marks.

One folio of his Western melodies was published by the Irving Berlin Company and another soon followed on the stands. It included his My Confession, I Wonder If You Feel The Way I Do, Spanish Two Step, and Steel Guitar Rag. The last named is a terrific request number where ever Bob Willis and his Texas Playboys appear.

Willis joined the Army in 1942 and served for nearly two years. Thirteen members of his original band went into the armed forces, and are now back in harness better than ever.

'Window' in Cow's Stomach Brings Award for Research

An Ohio veterinarian who built a 'window' in a cow's stomach has received the 1948 Borden award for 'outstanding dairy cattle disease research that has brought great benefits to mankind.' He is Dr. A. F. Schalk, chairman of the department of preventive veterinary medicine at Ohio State university, Columbus. 'It was Schalk who, while serving as a veterinary professor in North Dakota, first introduced a highly successful surgical technique for building a "window" in the bovine stomach, so that he could watch the feed arrive in the stomach, learn how it was handled there and find out how cattle digested different kinds of feeds and how they turned them into meat and milk for man. He made his research findings available to other scientists, showed them how to perform the operation, and had a movie made for use in veterinary college instruction, recording the digestive processes seen through the gastric fistula, as his window is called. The award, which was cited on an engraved scroll and accompanied by a check for \$1,000, also gave recognition to Schalk's part in the discovery that consuming damaged sweet clover hay produces a hemorrhagic, often fatal cattle disease and that transfusions of specially processed blood bring out a "spectacular recovery." A chemical in the damaged hay, dicoumarin, which causes the bleeding, now is being used widely in human and animal surgery to prevent fatal blood clots.

Birthplace of Bitters

Venezuela's remote Guiana highlands, where modern industrial minerals now are sought, contain both the gold mine that once was the world's richest, and the birthplace of Bitters. The mine is El Callao, which produced as much as \$30,000,000 worth of the metal in 1865. The bitters were invented in 1824 by a physician who lived in Anoronara, the early name for today's Ciudad Bolivar, on the Orinoco River. Later, the bitters factory was removed to Port of Spain, Trinidad.
