The nucleus of the First Methodist church in Gruver was the membership of the old Grand Prairie group of 26 members. This little band of Christians had been worshipping for several years in the school house five miles North of Gruver. Rev. O. M. Addison, who was pastor of the group held the first service in Gruver in the Gruver State Bank building back in 1929. About this time Mrs. J. P. Winder organized a community Sunday School in the old Post Office Building. When the school building was completed in 1930, the different denominations met there. When the county court house was torn down and Old Hansford moved to Spearman the brick from the old building was used to erect the Gruver Community church, which was complete and dedicated in February of 1932. In 1948 the building was purchased by the Gruver Methodist church. There being need of considerable repairs on the building, the idea was advanced to build a new church. On December 6th, 1949 the following committees were selected as Building and finance committees: Building Committee, Glendon H. Etling, L. K. Garrett, C. H. Winder, Mrs. Coy Holt and Mrs. W. L. Harris. Finance committee, Coy Holt, L. H. Gruver and A. R. Bort. These committees spent many long hours of painstaking and prayerful study and planning. The new building, truly a model of comfort and efficiency was completed and dedicated free of indebtedness November 18th, 1951.





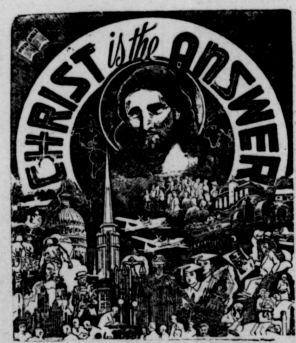
