### Economical Operation of Tractor

Tractor engines should operate within definite temperature limits for best economy and performance, according to Guy W. Gienger, extension agricultural engineer at the University of Maryland. To keep the cooling system working at its best he recommends: (1) Be sure the fan belt does not slip. There should be three-fourths inch deflection when you push against the belt, (2) Drain and flush the cooling system at least twice each year, (3) Keep the radiator clean to allow air to pass by all the cooling fins and tubes, and (4) Use clean soft water (rain water preferred) to prevent the accumulation of dirt and lime inside the engine. 




