The entire City of Spearman was in a state of Shock Tuesday, as result of a terrible collision, South of Spearman, Monday night, that took the life of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Brown. The accident occurred about 5 miles South, near the Garnett Irrigation well, at an intersection of two dirt roads
