



Farmers have two issues to decide in the June 20 wheat refern-5441 dum. according to Elzie Vander-5061 burg of Hansford County Agri-5562 cultural Stabilization and Conservation office.

The first issue is whether mar-2781 keting quotas will be in effect carrying with them penalities on 2121 "excess" wheat from farms (with 4596 more than 15 acres of wheat 5061 harvested as grain) on which allotment is exceeded. The second issue is the level of the avail-3921 able price support.

A two-thirds favorable vote is required to approve wheat mark-2471 eting quotas. Once quotas are ap-5241 proved, penalties for production 3781 in excess of the farm's quota are 2451 in effect for all farms in commercial wheat States which har-3321 vest over 15 acres of wheat for 5781 grain. The farm is generally all 5061 the wheat produced on the acre-5281 age allotment. Under quotas, also, 5401 price support on the 1958 wheat 4596 crop will be available at a 2261 minimum national average of \$1.78 per bushel-to those farm-2281 ers who are in compliance with their farm allotments.

Mr. Vanderburg explains that if more than one-third of the voters disapprove quotas, there will be no marketing quotas and no penalities for excess production. However, acreage allotments will remain in effect in the commercial area, and the price sup-5061 port will be available at 50 per cent of parity to those farmers who comply with their allotments.

Wheat marketing quotas and 3031 acreage allotments operate only 2651 in the 36 states designated as 3031 "commercial" wheat States, which 2701 include Texas. States must have allotments of more than 25,000 4351 acres of wheat to rate as 2301 commercial wheat State.



Wonder why a pond near the river, spring fed, doesn't produce excellent fishing? This answer is simple enough for an aquatic biologist. Spring fed streams contain practically no fertility at all and probably the lake is made in or on sand. Usually sand contains very little fer-
