These are only maximum prices. The OPA has emphasized, and much used equipment will be sold for less. Non-controlled items such as a cow or bale of hay cannot be thrown in with the sale of the controlled item and violation of the price ceiling will be held against both owner and auctioneer of a sale.

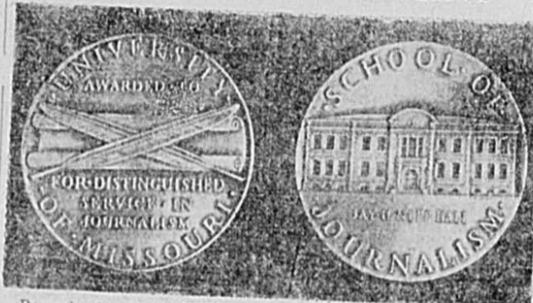
