

Birthplace of Bitters

Venezuela's remote Guiana highlands, where modern industrial minerals now are sought, contain both the gold mine that once was the world's richest, and the birthplace of bitters. The mine is El Callao, which produced as much as \$200,000 worth of the metal a month in 1885. The bitters were invented in 1824 by a physician who lived in Angostura, the early name for today's Ciudad Bolivar, on the Orinoco River. Later, the bitters factory was removed to Port of Spain, Trinidad.

Eliminate Sprouts

Small trees that come up voluntarily in the fence rows, along the foundation buildings, and other places where they are not wanted become a nuisance. Cutting them up again, and the work must be repeated over and over. This sprouting can be prevented and the trees eliminated by cutting only once if the cut surface of the stump is painted immediately after cutting with a mixture of one part Diesel fuel. The cutting can be done at any season of the year and makes a good winter job. If the 2,4-D solution contains less than 40 per cent ester, use proportionately more of it and less of the
