



Practical dairymen are agreed that the cows must have from six to ight weeks of rest following each lectation if they are to produce large uantities of milk year after year, he feeding of such cows during the rey period should be such as to enshe them to regain the losses sustined in the previous lactation and efore the onset of the demands of the succeeding lactation.

In making rations for cows in milk he roughage to be fed is the basis on hich to compound grain mixtures.

In making rations for cows in milk the roughage to be fed is the basis on which to compound grain mixtures. The condition of the individual cows governs the amount of grain to be fed. The needs of dry cows on good pasture are very easily met by a simple mixture composed of 300 opunds ground corn or ground barley or hominy feed, 300 pounds ground coats, 200 pounds bran, and 100 pounds linseed meal.

In winter feeding with silage and alfalfa hay available, the addition of 50 pounds of the linseed meal to the mixture given is satisfactory. For silage and other legume hay, add 100 pounds more of the linseed meal. Silage and mixed hay should have the protein content of the grain mixture further increased by the addition of 75 pounds linseed meal to the amount given for silage and legume hay, the total amount being 275 pounds.

"Improper construction is unfair to the whole community. A rapidly

spreading fire is a menace to all adjoining property and sometimes to a whole town. The solution lies in proper construction and proper fire prevention, supplemented by a well organized up-to-date fire department. But remember the fireman cannot do the whole job. They make inspections, recommend changes which will lessen fire hazards, but the main burden rests on the individual property owner. In his hands lies the saving of many thousands of lives and millions of dollars worth of property, which otherwise will be lost through fire every year."


