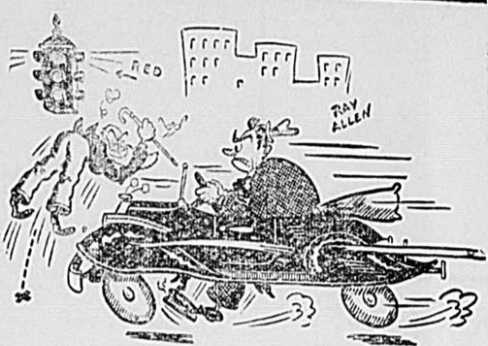

A. On the Colorado River near La Grango where Houston's army crossed.

Q. What effect if any is the Centennial having on attendance at county and community fairs in Texas this year?

Q. When did James Bowie first come to Texas?

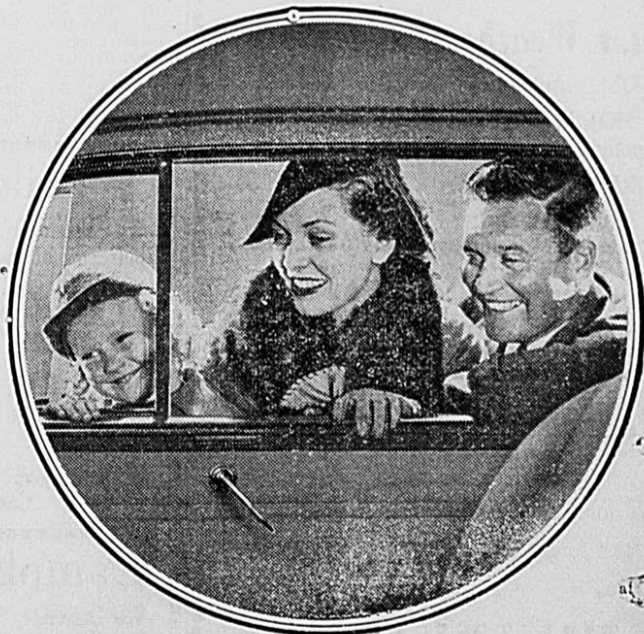
