

GOOD PORK CURING METHOD DESCRIBED

A brine method of curing pork that is coming into general use in Texas because it makes a deliciously flavored meat and is practical, is described by E. R. Eudaly, Swine Specialist of the A. & M. College Extension Service. "To make brine chough for 100 pounds of meat use 10 gallons of water, 20 pounds salt, 5 pounds sugar and 5 punces salt-peter. Bring the water to a boil, then add the salt and stir until dissolved. Add the sugar and saltpeter and again stir until dissolved. Allow to cool before using.

the nation wide movement being established by county and state bank era' associations and the American Bankers Association in cooperation with the state agricultural colleges and county agents for the purpose of bringing about both local and antional solutions for farm economic problems has shown notable results during the past year. A review of these activities in the Builetin of the Agricultural Commission, American Bankers Association, summarizes some of the chief points as follows:

In Missouri a meeting was held at the College of Agriculture at which the bankers again appropriated \$5.00 to stimulate beef calf clubs and report definite results obtained in getting farmers to lime their soil and grow alfalfa. County 'key bankers' to brom mote banker support of farm betterment projects are being appointed and another Short Course is Agriculture. In Kansas no less than-fifteen county mote banker support of farm betterment projects are being appointed and another Short Course is Agricultural college it was decided that the key bankers with agricultural for bankers is being planaed.

The Louisians bankers' agricultural committee met at the College of Agriculture in connection with a bankers' farm course. The bankers are thoroughly aroused to the wisdom of lick eradication and are co-operating to that end. County key bankers are being selected and county meetings with bankers throughout the state will be arranged.

In Kentucky key bankers have been appointed in each county with the result that the bankers of the state are co-operating with the College of Agriculture more specifically than any other group of business men. Some of the fruits of this co-operation is demonstrated by the fact that the number of dairy cattle in the state has increased seven per cent and the has increased seven per cent and the production per cow twelve per cent. Three counties in the state have elim-

production per cow twelve per cent. Three counties in the state have eliminated all scrub buils.

In North Carolina the oustanding accomplishments have been the honoring of "Class A Farmers," that is, those attaining a degree of proficiency in a well balanced and sound system of farming as indicated by a score card prepared by the College of Agriculture and the Bankers Short Course given there. Future plans provide for the continuation of the county key banker system and the arrangement of county banker-farmer tours.

In Virginia \$15,000 has been raised by subscription for boys' and girls' club work, largely from bankers. A group meeting was held at the College of Agriculture with two hundred bankers in attendance. The Committee on Agriculture of the State Bankers Association voted to continue and check up on the county-skey banker work.

The reports from New York on the activities for the past year included the distribution of 20,000 short form farm credit statements prepared cooperatively by the agricultural committee also arranged to send suggestions to the bankers' agricultural committee also arranged to send suggestions to the banks of the state to aid in financing purchase of state to aid in financing purchase of state to aid in financing purchase of





Any poultryman who persistently eliminates the liars from his flock will increase his profits from the flock to an almost unbelievable degree.

The value of a regular, scientifficulling out of drones from a poultry flock is vividly illustrated in the results of a survey conducted not long ago by the College of Agriculture of the University of Illinois and their farm advisors. The average profit on 264 flocks averaging 161 hens cach was 86 cents per hen, but the average ago no the best two thirds was \$2.2s per hen. Of course, not all of the least productive one-third deserved to be eliminated, there certainly must have been an astonishingly large number that were getting food and attention without giving and adequate return on what it cost to keep them. Culling out and marketing such hens can only result in a decreased expense account and a vastly increased average profit for each hen remaining.

There is nonining difficult or mysterious about culling, nothing a person of average intelligence could not learn in a short while. First of all start with the chicks as soon as they are out of the shell. Any that are obviously deformed should be killed at once. Culling should be made a continuous process from that time.


