

Wherever his accounts show a deficit or insufficient profit on one or more items, he immediately studies to overcome the handleap and correct any mistakes that have been made.

The Agricultural Commission of the American Bankers Association is conducting a nationwide educational campaign for better methods of farm accounting. The commission has been stressing the wisdom of country bankers through cooperation of county agents, calling farmers together, and holding account schools where instruction is given on the use of the farm



cheer required by any true worker.
Salvation for All. 1 Tim. 2:4,5
"Who would have all men to be saved." The Christian doctrine of election is to be interpreted in the light of passages such as this. God is Savior essentially and eternally; he longs for the salvation of every one of his creatures. "And come to the knowledge of the truth." A bare knowledge of the truth of Christ and salvation is not enough; the devils believe and tremble. It must be a saving knowledge, knowledge which leads to repentance and obedience, love and service.

Christ A "Ransom for All." v. 6. "Who gave himself a ransom for all." Of course a mere man could not serve as a ransom from sin for all men; only God could do that. But he could do it only as a man. "The testimony to be borne in its own times." That is, when the right time for it in the history of the world had arrived, the time for Christ's testimony to the sacrificial love of God, the New Testimony in his blood. Christ came in the fulness of time, when the world had sunk deepest in the mire of sin, and when a little nucleus of men was ready to receive the truth of redemption.

"Whereunto I was appointed a preacher and apostle." For the passing of this Testimony along, from the dying and risen Christ to the hearts of needy men, Paul was divinely appointed by the words of Christ himself on the Damascus road.
