Hansford County Farmers Becoming Interested in More Practical Methods

| "Indications are that the people of the Panhandle are becoming inmethods of farm culture, production and disposition of products. This is being evidenced in many ways and we would like to encourage this movement all possible. To enable us to form some worthwhile opinion of the situation generally, we are addressing you this inquiry and will appreciate it if you will respond to it, if you can conveniently and consistently do so," writes the Amarillo Board of City Development to the Reporter: Then follows a long list of questions, the answers to which bring out the following facts: <br> Hansford county farmers are taking to the diversified idea of farming at a rapid rate, and as a general rule are pulling through this year, with a short wheat crop, in fine shape. Spearman banks have about as much money on deposit as ever before in their history, and are always willing to help a worthy farmer with any worthy project. The Spearman country is shipping 1,000 pounds of | is increasing at a rapid rate. Three cars of pure bred milk cows were recently shipped into this country, more are on the way and five pure bred bulls have been placed with others to follow. Several car loads of hogs are shipped from Spearman cach month. The sheep-raising industry while in its infancy, is coming to the front as one of the county's important industries. About 10,000 head of sheep were shipped to the county last fall. Lambs are being purchased by local farmers, who wish to get started in the busiress. More raw land is being put in cultivation this year than in any two previous years of the county's history. A ten bushel wheat crop next year will equal, if not surpass, the 40 to 60 bushel crop of 1926. <br> M. and Mme.
