SUGAR FACTORY OPENS

Only Plant in Kansas to Begin Op-eration at Garden City October 23

At Garden City the beet sugar corporation which has the only plant in Kansas, is advertising its list of special employees for the "campaign" of sugar market. It expects to begin grinding beets about October 23rd and run for forty or fifty days. About five thousand acres of high quality beets were raised, mostly on company farms in the northwest part of Finey county, and digging and topping began today. The machinery will be started when a great emough pile is in the sheds to assure a day and night run without shutting down until the whole crop is "sugared." Several hundred men will be kept busy by the work, and the factory will prove
