





Newsy Notes of Spearman Hi

A fire drill was held Monday and the pupils made a new record for getting out of the building. All students were on the outside in 1 minute and 40 seconds. The pupils are instructed regarding the operation of the fire extinguishers. The pump' type are in each class room and a two and a half gallon chemical extinguisher is placed on each floor of the main building. The building being constructed of wood en tirely makes it necessary to pay special attention to fire prevention.

The two Spanish classes voted to subscribe for the Bulletin of the Pan-American Union. This bulletin comes to the school in the English edition, but the Spanish classes decided that they wanted to take a real Spanish magazine so they subscribed for the Bulletin in the Spanish edition.

There are sixteen students in both of the Spanish classes, and some splendid work is being done by them. They hope to organize some Spanish clubs in the near future, which will be interesting as well as helpful to them. They also propose to carry on an educational correspondence with pupils in schools in Spanish speaking countries.

Mr. Clark, our superintendent, is placing the following magazines that come to his private library, at the disposal of the students in the High School department: The Literary Digest; Asia, the American Magazine On the Orient; Current Opinion; Chemical Age; National Geographic Magazine; El Palacio; The Geographical Review; The Boys' Magazine; Popular Mechanics; School Life; The Amarillo Daily Tribune (newspaper).

The German Kall Works, recently contributed to our equipment, a fine collection of minerals and products of the German potash mines. The speci-mens are packed in glass show bottles. The minerals represented in the collection are: Kainit (2 specimens, light and dark), Carnaliit, Steinsalz, Sylvin, Hartsalz, Polyhalit, Schonit and Sylvinit. The products and fertilizer ma terials.are: Sulfate of Potash, Sulfate of Potash-Magnesia, Muriate of Potash, Ground Kainit, and 20 per cent Manure Salt. They have also supplied us with booklets "Plant Food," "Potash Industry" and "Principles of Profitable Farming" for each member of the advanced class in agriculture.

L. R. McComas, trustee, and Miss Bessie Cleaves, teacher, of the school in district No. 15, were visitors at the school on Saturday, November 19.

Mr. Edmonds, who is in charge of the county agent work in the Panhan-dle; Mr. Powers, county agent of Hemp. hill county, and Mr. Grooms, ex-county commissioner and progressive farmer, were visitors at the school last week. Each made a short but very instructive address. Secretary of the School Board H. E. James, was also in the party to make sure that the visitors were properly received at the school building. Both of the agricultural extension workers expressed themselves as being surprised that such a creditable school as ours could be built up in slightly over a year.




