



ORDINANCE NUMBER 2

Be it ordained by the Board of Al-demen of the town of Spearman, Texas, that there shall be assessed against each and every male resident of the town of Spearman, Texas, be-tween the ages of twenty-one and forty-five, both inclusive, except ministers of the gospel actually engaged in the discharge of their duties, an annual street tax in the sum of Five Dollars, which street tax may be paid in money or in labor upon the streets of the town; provided that the one so work-ing on the streets shall receive not more than the sum of One Dollar per day for such work on the streets,

Penalty for same: Be it ordained by the Board of Al-dermen of the town of Spearman, Texas, that it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to engage in fights or affrays within the town of Spearman, Texas, and it shall be un-lawful to use vulgar, profane or ob-scene language in any public place within such town, or to commit any act which, by the statutes of Texas, consti-tute a misdemeanor. The penalty for which shall be a fine in the sum of not more than One Hundred Dollars, and such fine may be payable either in money or in labor upon the streets of Spearman, Texas, at the rate of One Dollar per day. 
