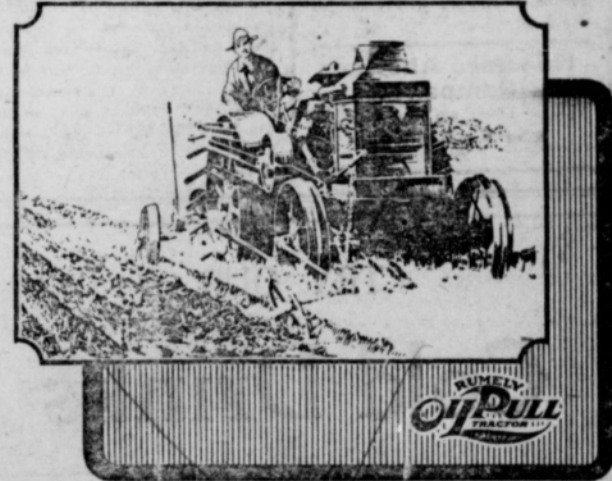

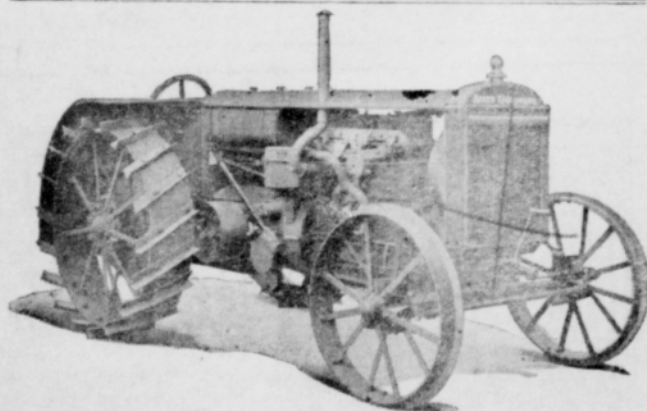

School Board Asks the People to Cooperate With Them

A petition in proper form and with sufficient signers was recently presented to the school board asking that an election be called for the purpose of allowing the people to increase the local school tax rate if they so desired. The school board has carefully weighed the proposition both from the standpoint of the school child and the property owner, and the candid opinion of each member of the board is that it is the logical thing to do. The tax rate is now lower here than it is in most districts maintaining good schools and the school board intends to keep it just as low as possible.

Governor Roberts once said: "Civilization begins and ends with the plow." There is much of the soil in Hansford county and in the trade territory of Spearman that has not been touched by the plow. People are moving into the country each day. One of the first questions that the new comer asks is: "What kind of a school have you?" If we are to continue to answer in terms that appeal to progressive citizens, funds must be provided to establish and equip first class and accredited high schools. The only possible way to provide the funds that is at all fair is by taxation.

Towns on all sides of us are improving their school facilities and by so doing are making their trade territory more attractive to settlers. If we are to see our country develop, we must provide first class schools. Our schools were overcrowded last term and a marked increase is expected this term. Additional equipment must be provided or we must refuse to admit some students and deprive others of the advantages of first class, accredited high school work.

On Saturday, August 20, 1921, the qualified voters who are property owners are asked to vote to increase the tax for maintenance purposes, not to exceed one dollar on the one hundred dollars valuation. This does not mean that the rate will be fixed at one dollar per hundred dollars valuation, but only means that the board may have the power and authority to levy an amount (not to exceed one dollar on the hundred dollars valuation) that will make possible the maintenance of schools having facilities sufficient to care for the demands made upon them.

The cost of instruction per pupil in the schools of the Spearman Independent District last year was only .62 4 per cent of what the average was for all the other schools of Hansford county for the same year. This is based on the annual reports made to the State Department of Education and approved by the State Superintendent.

Trusting that the people will cooperate with us in order that better schools may be provided throughout the district, we are,

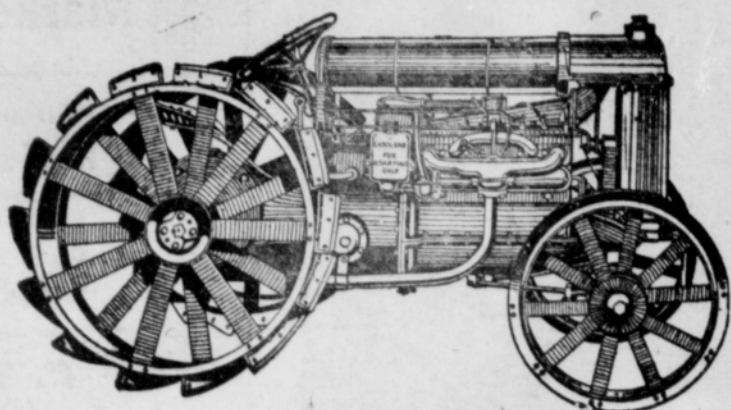
